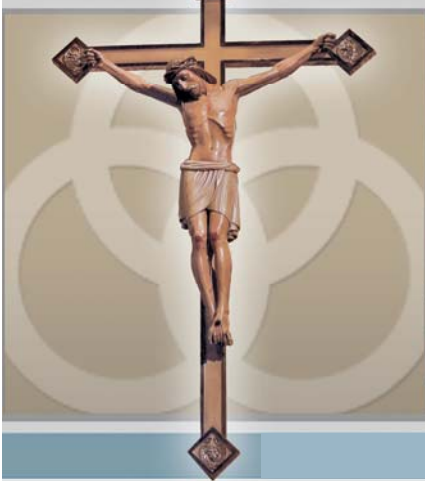

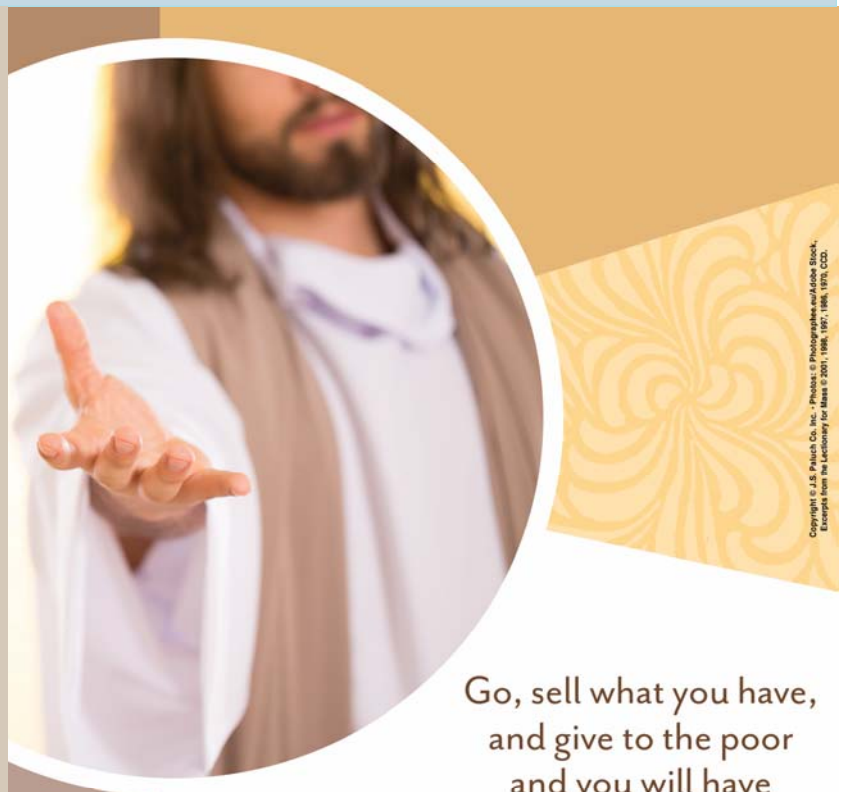

Today's scriptures point to the value of the gifts of wisdom, trusting in God, and letting our actions reflect the love of God from within. It is not gold that causes us to fall, but rather the desire for gold above all other things. From the readings in Wisdom and Hebrews, we find the source of God's gifts in our lives. Wisdom is more valuable than worldly possessions. In Hebrews, we are challenged to look at our own values and admit honestly what controls our lives.

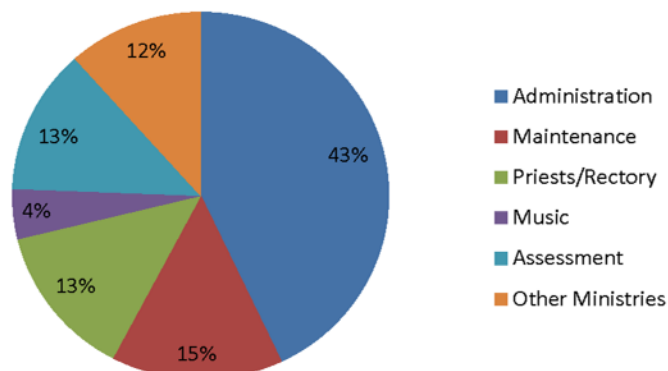

Dispensation Now Lifted (Effective June 19, 2021)

The dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation in response to the coronavirus pandemic **HAS NOW BEEN LIFTED** for the Catholic faithful of the Archdiocese of Los Angeles.



Those who have serious and legitimate reasons (e.g., illness, underlying health conditions that renders them susceptible to illness, significant fears of becoming ill, etc.) are dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation.

In these cases, Pastors are to encourage the faithful to keep the Lord’s Day holy by reading the Gospels, praying with their families, or joining themselves to the sacrifice of the Mass by making an Act of Spiritual Communion (found on page nine of this bulletin).

Scripture Focus:

Today Jesus predicts His suffering, rejection and resurrection for the third time. The pattern is always the same: Jesus predicts His suffering, the disciples fail to understand; Jesus then teaches clearly about Himself and about what following Him means. In His third prediction of suffering, Jesus describes how He will be handed over to His own people's religious leaders and to the Gentiles and will be spit upon and mocked. James and John, Jesus' inner circle of followers, get caught up on the glory promised. They argue for first place. But Jesus points out to them that true greatness is serving the real needs of others—not what the masses of people or the ones in power want.

Reflection:

1. When has suffering in your life caused you to see things differently?
2. Describe an experience when you were required to do something you didn't want to do or when there was very little "glory" in the giving.
3. Can you recall a personal incident when your prayerful request was seemingly refused, but in hindsight you understood that God answered it?
4. What does "following Jesus" mean to you?
