## Dear Parishioners:

On June 27<sup>th</sup>, the Holy Father approved and on 29<sup>th</sup> June, the Congregation for the Clergy published an Instruction regarding parishes and their structure to better serve the “singular mission of evangelization.” The Instruction is called: The pastoral conversion of the parish community in the service of the evangelizing mission of the Church. Clearly, they were not striving for pithiness. I’m betting most of you have not read the document, so let me highlight parts of it.

The document does not set down any new legislation but rather sets guidelines and suggestions. Most of the Instruction deals with matters which we in the United States have done for many years, such as the use of electronic media; the centrality of the source and summit of the Faith: the Eucharist; subdivisions within a diocese (such as deaneries); and various similar matters which do not call for any change in any US diocese that I know of. These might have application for change in newer areas of the Church. However, the themes and emphases of the document are worth noting for our application.

Monsignor Andrea Ripa, the Under-Secretary of the Congregation for the Clergy described the document stated that “One could say that the essence of the present Instruction is to recall that in the Church ‘there is a place for all and all can find their place’ with respect to each one’s vocation.” He also said that the Instruction seeks to “foster a greater co-responsibility and collaboration among all the baptized,” and to preserve “the faithful from certain possible extremes, such as the clericalization of the laity and the secularization of the clergy, or from regarding permanent deacons as ‘half-priests’ or a ‘super laymen.’”

Although the guidelines do not call for any structural changes in a parish such as Holy Trinity, what should we notice in the US? For those parishes where the laity are not significantly involved in the mission of the parish, the Instruction is a good reminder that the call for evangelization and the missionary sense of every parish is one that applies to all, not just the clergy; the transformation [of people] inspired by the Holy Spirit involves “the entire people of God;” but that the priest is to be the leader of the parish. In some parishes here and there in the Western World, one can find parishes where the priest tries to do everything and leave no discretion or role for the laity. In some parishes, it has occurred that the laity have tried to usurp the role and responsibility of the priest. Neither is correct.

The mission work is not just the responsibility of the hierarchy, but of all the whole community. In this, the distinct charism of priests, deacons, and laity are to be emphasized. For us, what can we take? Encouragement. Encouragement that each of us has a part in the mission of the parish, that each of us has a

part, a responsibility, in the work of evangelization, both within the parish and outside the parish.

So: what do you do for the work of the parish? There are a great many opportunities, as I have frequently written and talked about. If you are not doing your part, it’s not too late to start!

Last Monday’s report from **40 Days for Life** President, Shawn Carney, held the good news that 212 babies have been saved in this international campaign so far! Praise God! In Milwaukee, WI 6 babies were spared in one day. The first mom to choose life stayed in the abortion clinic for only three minutes before she exited and told the 40 Days volunteers outside, “This isn’t right; I can’t do it!” In Fargo, ND 2 babies were saved. In Thousand Oaks, CA a man approached 40 Days campaign volunteers and expressed his thanks for the volunteers’ courage in witnessing for life. He said he lost a niece or nephew to abortion decades ago and he and his sister continue to mourn the death of the child. Sadly, abortion numbers are up significantly compared with last year as fears surrounding the ongoing pandemic have driven desperate mothers to conclude their best option is to have their children killed. So, volunteers will continue to stand in solidarity with the babies who lose their lives each day in the abortion clinics, giving their time for moms and babies knowing that God will use all their efforts and prayers so that one day abortion will be unthinkable. **PRAY TO END ABORTION.
