I will remember you daily in my prayers and in my Masses. Entrust yourself to the Holy Trinity and you will be safe.



Jim just celebrated his 25th anniversary of his ordination. He has served twice at St. Alphonso in Crossville, TN for a total of 13 years. We look forward to his tenure at Holy Trinity.

PRO-LIFE NEWS AND NOTES:

Despite the enormous push by the current administration to extend, protect and fully fund abortion, pro-lifers continue to work strenuously to protect the lives of all human beings, especially the innocent unborn. As of several days ago, 561 abortion restrictions have been introduced in 47 states, including 165 abortion bans. A total of 83 of those restrictions have already passed. However, earlier this month, Democrats in Congress re-introduced a radical pro-abortion bill. The so-called Women's Health Protection Act would protect abortion as a "right", and overturn and prevent any abortion restrictions that aren't applied to a "medically comparable procedure." This means the federal legislation would strike down popular state laws establishing 24-hour waiting periods before an abortion is performed, informed-consent laws, bans on sex-selective abortion, and many health and safety regulations. Marjorie Dannenfelser, President of the Susan B. Anthony List, said of the bill, "The deceptively named Women's Health Protection Act is an extreme federal takeover that would directly attack the rights of the American people to enact and enforce pro-life laws through their duly elected legislators". If the wealthy pro-abortion lobby groups like Planned Parenthood and the Guttmacher Institute are successful in pushing through the passage of this anti-life bill, the pro-life progress that was accomplished during the last presidential administration and during many previous years of hard work will be wiped out. This is not the first time the WHPA has been introduced by the Democrats in Congress; it has been introduced every year since 2013. According to the pro-abortion group, Act for Women, this time the WHPA was introduced with 176 supporters in the House and 48 in the Senate or "more than in any previous Congress at introduction." At this time, there is probably not enough support to guarantee the bill's passage, but if Democrats are able to pick up more seats in the Senate in 2022 and crush the filibuster, there is a danger that this bill could become law at some point. Please pray that the WHPA never becomes law and that by the grace of God, the Supreme Court Overturns Roe vs. Wade.

SPIRITUAL ADOPTION OF THE UNBORN - The babies who

are in danger of abortion for whom you have been praying are now 7 months old in the womb. At the end of the 7th month of pregnancy, fat begins to deposit on the baby. He or she is about 14 - 16 inches long and weighs about 2 - 4 pounds. If born prematurely, baby would probably survive after the 7th month of pregnancy.
