FAIRBNAKS COMMUNITY FOOD BANK

Fairbanks Community Food Bank collects and redistributes donated food to individuals and agencies. The primary purpose of the Food Bank is to provide food for the hungry and to distribute surplus food that would ordinarily be discarded. All locally collected food is to be distributed without charge.

There is a blue collection tub in the entryway of the Church, to collect Non-perishable foods for the food bank. Items such as dehydrated vegetables, canned, and boxed or packaged snacks, cereals and Thanksgiving food items may be deposited in the box before Masses or weekdays during office hours. Please, no perishable items. Turkeys should be taken directly to the Food Bank. Thank you for helping to feed those who are struggling in these most difficult of times.
