COAR is located in Zaragoza, El Salvador. It was founded in 1980 by a Cleveland Diocese Mission Team Priest, Fr. Ken Myers during El Salvador's brutal civil war. Fr. Ken and fellow Cleveland Mission Team Members, Sr. Dorothy Kazel, OSU, and Jean Donovan (murdered December 2, 1980) began gathering orphans from refugee camps and bringing them back to the Mission's parish of Zaragoza.

COAR is now known as the "Children's Village" in El Salvador with 800 day students, 100 in foster care, a medical and dental clinic, pharmacy, trade shops (such as baking and tailoring). COAR buzzes with optimism and vitality.

SECOND COLLECTION THIS WEEKEND

Second Collection this weekend Saturday, July 16th and Sunday, July 17th – Honduran Partnership Collection - A special collection for the benefit of the Honduran dioceses of Le Ceiba and San Pedro Sula will be taken up at parishes in the Diocese of San Angelo July 16 and 17.

This year the partnership (*Hermanamiento*) among the dioceses of Tyler, La Ceiba, San Pedro Sula, and San Angelo celebrates its 15th anniversary. The collection to assist our fellow Catholics in the Honduran dioceses and parishes goes back even further, when it began as a means of providing relief from Hurricane Mitch. The collection is used now by partner parishes and dioceses to promote evangelization, provide basic education and extend assistance to the disadvantaged of the community.

The collection is divided between the two Honduran dioceses. In situations in which parishes from the Diocese of San Angelo are partnered with parishes in Honduras, what is collected benefits the partner parish directly.

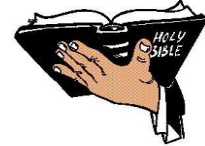

Sunday's Reflections
Colossians 1:24-28

NOT ENOUGH SUFFERING

There is too much suffering in the world. Everyone agrees. There is too much sickness, too much enmity, too much jealousy, too much violence, too much poverty, too much anxiety, and too much death.

It is strange then to hear the Letter to the Colossians imply there has not yet been enough suffering. Paul says, "Now I rejoice in my sufferings for your sake, and in my flesh I am filling up what is lacking in the afflictions of Christ."

Certainly there was nothing "lacking" in the afflictions of Christ—abandoned by his friends, betrayed by an apostle, arrested and manhandled, falsely accused, beaten, and flogged, made to carry the instrument of his torture, and nailed to it, then lifted high, to die, on a cross. Nothing was lacking.

Yet suffering has continued. Some people have known sorrows, torture, and pain even worse than that. The cross of Christ did not end suffering. But it rendered suffering powerless before the glory of the cross. Paul says he rejoices in his sufferings "to bring to completion for you the word of God, the mystery hidden from ages and from generations past." That mystery is now made manifest: "It is Christ in you, the hope of glory."

It feels like we have had too much suffering, but even if there is more, it cannot harm us. Suffering has no power before the promise of glory in Christ.
