Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On the weekend of June 1-2, 2019, our diocese will take up a collection for the Catholic Communication Campaign (CCC). Fully 50% of collected funds are used to support the communications efforts of our own diocese, while the other 50% of funds support communications projects around the world.

Let me share just one example of the impact of your generosity. In the Philippines, the island of Samar is home to nearly two million people, about 90% of whom are Catholic. Many live in remote villages outside the reach of television and Internet. Instead, radio is a critical source of information. The Catholic Church has provided the people of Samar with spiritual programming through a dedicated radio station for 20 years.

However, in 2013, Typhoon Haiyan hit the island. It destroyed the entire radio station. The community has been unable to fund a new station, leaving hundreds of thousands without access to spiritual messages.

Your support for the Catholic Communication Campaign is now helping the local diocese to rebuild the station. Because of you, people can once again hear radio programs that deepen their faith. You have given our brothers and sisters access to Catholic spiritual resources that they otherwise would not have received. It is only through your generosity that this project, and others like it, can spread the Gospel around the world.

Reflexiones del domingo
Apocalipsis 21: 10-14, 22-23
APAGAR LAS LUCES

Un corte de energía elimina la utilidad de muchos aparatos. Las computadoras y los teléfonos móviles tienen baterías, pero deben cargarse. Las cocinas dependen de la electricidad para la preparación de alimentos. El abridor de la puerta del garaje falla. Y, por supuesto, las luces se apagan. De hecho, las personas a veces describen un corte de energía en esos términos: "Nuestras luces se apagaron". Se apagó mucho más, pero las luces significan más para nosotros que cualquier otra cosa.

En los días previos a la electricidad, el sol y la luna proporcionaban una luz muy necesaria. Sin ellos, la vida sería impensable. La noche trajo terrores e inseguridades largamente olvidadas por sociedades más civilizadas.

Entonces, cuando el Libro de la Revelación imagina vivir en un mundo sin sol y luna, la imagen es inconcebible. Pero aquí había una ciudad que brillaba como una joya, fortificada con muros y penetrada por doce puertas magníficamente armoniosas, llamadas así por las tribus de Israel. La revelación dice que los cuerpos celestes no tuvieron ningún propósito luminoso para esta nueva Jerusalén. "La gloria de Dios le dio luz, y su lámpara era el Cordero". No se necesitaba ninguna otra luz.

Cada uno de nosotros ha conocido un momento en que la gloria de Dios fue nuestra única luz. Nuestras vidas se debilitaron por la pérdida de ingresos, amigos, autoridad o energía eléctrica.

Cuando la luz de nuestros ojos finalmente se cierra, cuando la oscuridad creciente de la muerte nos envuelve, una luz brillará para disipar nuestro miedo y llevarnos a casa: la luz de Cristo.

Revelation 21:10-14, 22-23
LIGHTS OUT

A power outage eliminates the usefulness of many appliances. Computers and mobile phones have batteries, but they have to be charged. Kitchens rely on electricity for food preparation. The garage door opener fails. And, of course, the lights go out. In fact, people sometimes describe a power outage in those terms: "Our lights went out." Much more went out, but the lights mean more to us than anything else.

In the days before electricity, the sun and the moon provided much-needed light. Without them, life would be unthinkable. The night brought terrors and insecurities long forgotten by more civilized societies.

So when the Book of Revelation envisions living in a world without sun and moon, the image is inconceivable. But here was a city gleaming like a jewel, fortified with walls, and penetrated by twelve magnificently harmonious gates, named for the tribes of Israel. Revelation says the heavenly bodies served no luminous purpose for this new Jerusalem. "The glory of God gave it light, and its lamp was the Lamb." No other light was needed.

Each of us has known a time when the glory of God was our only light. Our lives were dimmed by loss of income, friends, authority—or electrical power.

When the light of our eyes finally closes, when the gathering darkness of death envelopes us, one light shall shine to dispel our fear and bring us home: the light of Christ.
