Reflexiones del domingo
Efesios 1: 17-23

Fuente de alimentación

Las naciones construyen su poder a través de la política, las armas y la riqueza. Los líderes fuertes pueden unir a su gente para promover una causa. Los arsenales poderosos pueden vencer a los enemigos. El dinero puede comprar influencia y tecnología. Las naciones se sienten seguras cuando tienen el poder.

Como ciudadanos, a veces tomamos falsas esperanzas en la seguridad de nuestra nación. Es casi imposible protegerse contra cada ataque, controlar a cada enemigo y proteger nuestros tesoros nacionales. Es tentador confiar en los estándares del poder nacional: política, armas y riqueza.

La Carta a los Efesios toma otra visión del poder. Asume que todo poder pertenece a Dios, no a las personas, y que Dios le ha asignado autoridad a Cristo, "resucitarlo de los muertos y sentarlo a su diestra en los cielos". Dios puso todas las cosas debajo de los pies de Cristo " y le dio por cabeza sobre todas las cosas ".

Pero Jesús no es un político. No posee armas. Él no posee riquezas terrenales. Su dominio difiere del de los gobernantes temporales. Los creyentes de cada nación ponen su confianza en Cristo. Siguen sus enseñanzas. Lo más importante, creen que él es el vencedor sobre la muerte. Jesús ha vencido a la muerte, el enemigo de todo ser humano. Con Jesús como nuestra cabeza, disfrutamos de una libertad sin igual y de la liberación de todos nuestros temores.

Los que siguen a Cristo confían en otras formas de poder: el amor perfecto de Dios y del prójimo.

Sunday's Reflections
Ephesians 1:17-23
POWER SOURCE

Nations build up their power through politics, weapons and wealth. Strong leaders can unite their people to promote a cause. Mighty arsenals can overcome enemies. Money can buy influence and technology. Nations feel secure when they hold power.

As citizens, we sometimes take false hope in the security of our nation. It is nearly impossible to guard against every attack, to control every enemy and to protect our national treasures. It is tempting to rely on the standards of national power: politics, weapons and wealth.

The Letter to the Ephesians takes another view of power. It assumes that all power belongs to God, not to people, and that God has assigned authority to Christ, "raising him from the dead and seating him at his right hand in the heavens." God put all things beneath the feet of Christ "and gave him as head over all things."

But Jesus is no politician. He owns no weapons. He possesses no earthly wealth. His dominion differs from that of temporal rulers. Believers of every nation put their trust in Christ. They follow his teachings. Most importantly, they believe he is the victor over death. Jesus has conquered death, the enemy of every human. With Jesus as our head, we enjoy unparalleled freedom and release from all our fears.

Those who follow Christ put their trust in other forms of power—perfect love of God and neighbor.
