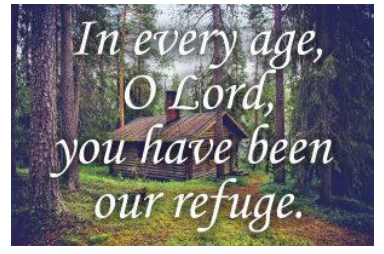

Reflexiones del domingo
Filemon 9:10, 12-17
ESCLAVO FUGITIVO

El libro más corto de la Biblia es la Carta de Pablo a Filemón. Solo tiene un capítulo de largo. Paul se hizo amigo de Filemón, probablemente en un viaje misionero. Paul probablemente se quedó con Filemón, donde conoció a un joven llamado Onésimo. Onésimo era uno de los esclavos de Filemón.

Algún tiempo después de que se despidieron, Paul fue arrestado y aterrizado en prisión. Allí continuó su ministerio de evangelización. Escribió cartas a las comunidades e individuos que había conocido en el camino.

Un día Paul recibió un visitante en su celda de la prisión. ¡Era Onésimo! ¡Se había escapado de Filemón! Paul continuó instruyendo al joven y probablemente lo bautizó. En prisión, Paul se había convertido en el "padre" de Onésimo.

Pero Onésimo tuvo que regresar. Así que Paul sacó bolígrafo y papel y escribió una carta a Filemón en nombre del fugitivo. "Quizás es por eso que estubo lejos de ti por un tiempo", escribió Paul, "para que puedas tenerlo de vuelta para siempre, ya no como un esclavo, sino más que un esclavo, un hermano".

Paul firmó la carta, una copia original manuscrita y autografiada de uno de los libros de la Biblia, y la pasó a través de los barrotes de su prisión a las humildes manos de un esclavo fugitivo, que la trajo a casa.

Es el libro más corto de la biblia. Pero tiene un gran tema. Si puede liberar a alguien más escribiendo una carta, hágalo.

Sunday's Reflections
Philemon 9-10, 12-17
RUNAWAY SLAVE

The shortest book of the bible is Paul's Letter to Philemon. It is only one chapter long. Paul became friends with Philemon, probably on a missionary journey. Paul probably stayed with Philemon, where he got to know a young fellow named Onesimus. Onesimus was one of Philemon's slaves.

Sometime after they said farewell, Paul was arrested and landed in prison. There he continued his ministry of evangelization. He wrote letters to the communities and individuals he had met along the way.

One day Paul received a visitor to his prison cell. It was Onesimus! He had run away from Philemon! Paul continued to instruct the young man and probably baptized him. In prison, Paul had become the "father" of Onesimus.

But Onesimus had to go back. So Paul pulled out pen and paper and wrote a letter to Philemon on behalf of the runaway. "Perhaps this is why he was away from you for a while," Paul wrote, "that you might have him back forever, no longer as a slave, but more than a slave, a brother."

Paul signed the letter—a handwritten, autographed, original copy of one of the books of the bible—and passed it through the bars of his prison into the humble hands of a runaway slave, who brought it home.

It is the shortest book in the bible. But it has a big theme. If you can free someone else by writing a letter, do it.
