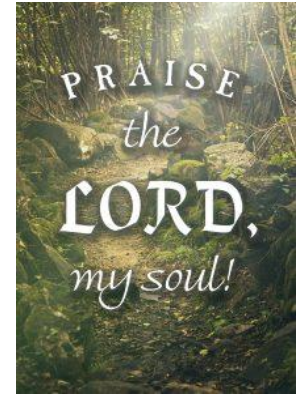

1 Timoteo 6:11-16
LA NOBLE CONFESIÓN

No siempre defendemos nuestras creencias. Decimos que los pobres tienen derechos, pero no siempre votamos en su nombre. Queremos poner fin al hambre en el mundo, pero no alentamos a nuestros funcionarios electos a que lo pongan fin. Queremos paz en la tierra, pero no sin un poco de venganza.

A veces sucumbimos a los valores menores de los demás. Comemos alimentos que no debemos. Bebemos más de lo que deberíamos. Algunas personas abusan de sustancias ilegales. Es difícil defender nuestras creencias durante una multitud que piensa lo contrario.

Pero debemos hacerlo. La primera carta a Timoteo dice: "Persigue la justicia, la devoción, la fe, el amor, la paciencia y la gentileza". Queremos hacerlo, pero es difícil. "Compete bien por la fe", continúa la carta, como si pudiera leer nuestro corazón. Nuestra fe se siente como una competencia. Queremos hacer lo correcto, pero es fácil fallar. Debemos competir por nuestra fe.

La carta recuerda el testimonio que Jesús dio bajo Poncio Pilato. En un momento de prueba en todos los sentidos de la palabra, Jesús se mantuvo firme y dio testimonio de "la noble confesión". Perdió la vida, pero ganó el mundo.

Cuando defendemos nuestras creencias, podemos perder amigos, apoyo, popularidad o vida. Pero ganamos tranquilidad, un corazón firme y la confianza de que Dios nos mira amablemente y que, en tiempos de prueba, hizo la noble confesión.

Sunday's Reflections
1 Timothy 6:11-16
THE NOBLE CONFESSION

We do not always stand up for our beliefs. We say the poor have rights, but we do not always vote on their behalf. We want an end to world hunger, but we do not encourage our elected officials to end it. We want peace on earth, but not without a little revenge.

Sometimes we succumb to the lesser values of others. We eat foods we should not. We drink more than we should. Some people abuse illegal substances. It is hard to stand up for our beliefs during a crowd that thinks otherwise.

But we must. The First Letter to Timothy says, "Pursue righteousness, devotion, faith, love, patience, and gentleness." We want to, but it's hard. "Compete well for the faith," the letter continues, as if it can read our heart. Our faith feels like a competition. We want to do the right thing, but it is easy to fail. We must compete for our faith.

The letter recalls the testimony Jesus gave under Pontius Pilate. At a time of trial in every sense of the word, Jesus remained firm and gave testimony for "the noble confession." He lost his life, but he gained the world.

When we take a stand for our beliefs, we may lose friends, support, popularity—or life. But we gain peace of mind, a firm heart, and the confidence that God looks kindly upon us who—in times of trial—made the noble confession.
