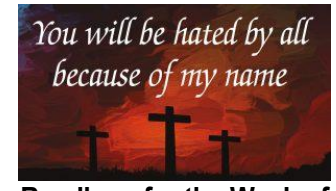

Reflexiones del domingo
2 Tesalonicenses 3:7-12
LA COMUNIDAD FELIZ

Vivir en comunidad es difícil. En una familia, una escuela o el lugar de trabajo, es difícil llevarse bien con los demás. Hay beneficios para la vida comunitaria. Cuando no puedes hacerlo por tu cuenta, otros te levantan. Usted se beneficia de las habilidades y el amor que comparten. Y cuando otros necesitan ayuda, estás ahí. Te sientes satisfecho cuando usas tus dones para ayudar a alguien más. Una comunidad feliz disfruta de muchas bendiciones. Los dones de los individuos son maravillosos de contemplar, pero aún más es el resultado: la comunidad se convierte en su propia fuerza viviente, con su propio amor, devoción y compromiso.

Funciona mientras todos ayuden. Tan pronto como alguien no lo hace, el resentimiento se arrastra y la belleza de la comunidad es destruida.

Pablo el Apóstol enfrentó este problema cuando él y sus compañeros visitaron a los Tesalonicenses. Algunas personas se aprovechaban de otras. No estaba funcionando, y nunca funcionaría. Entonces los misioneros dieron un ejemplo. Eran invitados. No tuvieron que hacer nada para ayudar, pero lo hicieron. "Queríamos presentarnos como un modelo para usted", escribió Paul. "Cuando estuvimos con usted, le dijimos que si alguien no estaba dispuesto a trabajar, tampoco debía comer". No existe un almuerzo gratis.

Tu iglesia es una comunidad. Se basa en su fe, su participación y su ayuda. Comes y bebes la Eucaristía. ¿Tu también trabajas?

Sunday's Reflections
2 Thessalonians 3:7-12
THE HAPPY COMMUNITY

Living in community is hard. In a family, a school, or the workplace, it is hard to get along with others. There are benefits to community life. When you cannot make it on your own, others lift you up. You benefit from the skills and love they share. And when others need help, you are there. You feel satisfied when you use your gifts to help someone else. A happy community enjoys many blessings. The gifts of individuals are marvelous to behold, but even more so is the result—the community becomes its own living force, with its own love, devotion, and commitment.

It works as long as everyone helps out. As soon as someone does not, resentment creeps in, and the beauty of the community is destroyed.

Paul the Apostle faced this problem when he and his companions visited the Thessalonians. Some people were taking advantage of others. It was not working, and it would never work. So the missionaries set an example. They were guests. They did not have to do anything to help out, but they did. "We wanted to present ourselves as a model for you," Paul wrote. "When we were with you, we instructed you that if anyone was unwilling to work, neither should that one eat." There is no such thing as a free lunch.

Your church is a community. It relies on your faith, your participation, and your help. You eat and drink the Eucharist. Do you also work?
