The San Angelo Diocese Immigration Services in our three deaneries have been open for a few years. The services include processing documents for such things as Naturalization and Citizenship Applications, Alien Relative Petitions, Adjustment of Status Immigrations Benefit Applications, Temporary Protective Status, Deferred Action for Childhood Arrival (Dream Act), Waiver of Disability, and Work Permits. Romanos 6:3-4, 8-11
LOS MUERTOS VIVIENTES

Hablan de alguien condenado a muerte como un hombre muerto caminando. La persona condenada a morir es tan buena como muerta. Él o ella puede estar caminando, pero su vida prácticamente ha terminado.

Todos los cristianos pueden ser llamados personas muertas caminando, aunque de una manera diferente. En el bautismo, morimos al pecado, pero seguimos caminando en la nueva vida de Cristo. Los cristianos pueden estar muertos, pero nuestra vida prácticamente ha comenzado.

Algunos cristianos son bautizados como infantes. Algunos son bautizados como adultos. Cuando los adultos se bautizan, se les pide que renuncien a su antigua forma de vida, que se alejen de todo lo que les impide ser fieles a Cristo. Cuando los bebés se bautizan, los padres y los padrinos renuevan su compromiso con Cristo y se comprometen a compartirlo con el niño. El bautismo hace toda la diferencia en el mundo. Redirige totalmente nuestras vidas hacia Cristo, ya sea que cambiemos de rumbo como adultos o nos comprometamos con Cristo desde el principio cuando somos bebés.

Sunday's Reflections
Romans 6:3-4, 8-11
THE WALKING DEAD

They speak of someone on death row as a dead man walking. The person sentenced to die is as good as dead. He or she may be walking around, but their life has virtually ended.

All Christians can be called dead people walking, though in a different way. In baptism, we die to sin, but we continue to walk in the new life of Christ. Christians may be dead, but our life has virtually begun.

Some Christians are baptized as infants. Some are baptized as adults. When adults are baptized, they are asked to renounce their former way of life, to turn away from anything that keeps them from allegiance to Christ. When infants are baptized, parents and godparents renew their commitment to Christ, and they pledge to share it with the child. Baptism makes all the difference in the world. It totally redirects our lives toward Christ, whether we are changing courses as adults, or commit ourselves to Christ from the start as infants.

St. Paul says to the Romans, "You too must think of yourselves as dead to sin and living for God in Christ Jesus." Christians are dead yet walking.

Throughout our lives we recommit ourselves to our baptismal promises. We do it weekly at church when we recite the Creed. We do it anytime we attend a baptism. We also do it each year at the Easter Vigil. We turn away from sin and turn toward Christ, who shows us how to walk in the newness of life.
