Reflexiones del domingo
Filipenses 1: 20c-24, 27a
CUESTIÓN DE VIDA O MUERTE

Cuando la muerte amenaza con apoderarse de nosotros, luchamos por la vida. Amamos la vida que hemos recibido de Dios. Lo atesoramos. Hacemos todo lo posible para preservarlo. Como cristianos, no tememos a la muerte. Creemos que conduce a la paz. Pero tampoco adelantamos la muerte.

Las personas que no temen a la muerte son figuras asombrosas. En el mejor de los casos, arriesgan sus vidas por su familia, su fe o su país. Pero los héroes más simples eligen no luchar contra la muerte que se aproxima, ya sea por el sigilo de una enfermedad o por el ataque de la mano de un enemigo.

Es fascinante escuchar el comienzo de la Carta de San Pablo a los Filipenses: "Porque para mí la vida es Cristo y la muerte es ganancia. ... Anhele dejar esta vida y estar con Cristo, porque eso es mucho mejor. Sin embargo, que yo permanezca en la carne es más necesario para su beneficio".

Muerte o vida: Paul podía llevarse cualquiera. Su vida ayudó a las personas que necesitaban su ejemplo y predicación. Pero su muerte lo llevaría a Cristo. Dada la opción, Pablo prefirió vivir en Cristo. Después de todo, su trabajo había traído más de lo que le correspondía en tormentos y torturas. Le esperaba una paz gloriosa. Pero tenía trabajo que hacer y lo aceptó.

Luchamos por preservar nuestra vida, pero con fe aceptamos lo que nos espera en la muerte. La vida es Cristo. La muerte es ganancia.

Sunday's Reflections
Philippians 1:20c-24, 27a
MATTER OF LIFE AND DEATH

When death threatens to overtake us, we fight for life. We love the life we have received from God. We treasure it. We make every effort to preserve it. As Christians, we do not fear death. We believe it leads to peace. But we do not advance death either.

People who have no fear of death are awesome figures. At their best, they risk their lives for their family, their faith, or their country. But simpler heroes choose not to fight the approach of death, whether it comes by stealth of disease or by the onslaught of an enemy's hand.

It is riveting to hear the opening of St. Paul's Letter to the Philippians: "For to me life is Christ, and death is gain. ... I long to depart this life and be with Christ, for that is far better. Yet that I remain in the flesh is more necessary for your benefit."

Death or life—Paul could take either one. His life helped people who needed his example and preaching. But his death would bring him to Christ. Given the choice, Paul preferred living in Christ. After all, his work had brought more than its share of torment and torture. Glorious peace awaited him. But he had work to do, and he accepted it.

We fight to preserve our lives, but in faith we accept what awaits us in death. Life is Christ. Death is gain
