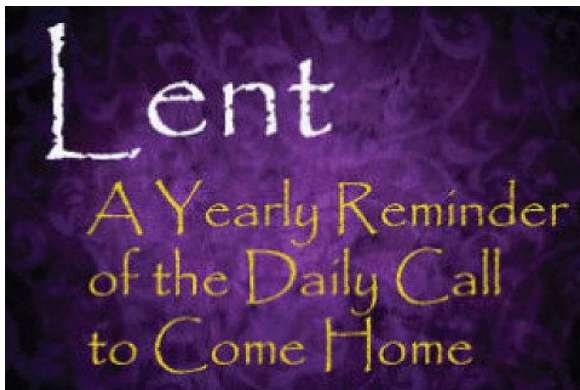

PER BISHOP SIS

Due to the COVID pandemic, Catholics in the Diocese of San Angelo are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass on Sunday's and holy days of obligation until further notice.

PER BISHOP SIS

We have received new protocols from Bishop Sis. These continue to include social distancing of 6 feet, wearing of masks, over the nose and mouth and if you are feeling any symptoms please stay home and seek medical attention.

All Communion ministers, including clergy, must use a face mask or cloth face covering over the nose and mouth. All choir members and musicians are also required to follow the rules of social distancing and all are expected to wear face masks or cloth face coverings over the nose and mouth throughout the Mass, including when singing or playing musical instruments.

Baptisms are subject to the same social distancing, face mask and spacing requirements as Mass in the Church. Quinceaneras and weddings are subject to the same social distancing, face masks, and spacing requirements as other Masses in the Church. Exercise caution and avoid large gatherings. Before scheduling a Quinceanera or wedding, please wait until a phase when sufficient crowds are allowed inside the church to accommodate the group safely.

Funerals are subject to the same social distancing, face mask and spacing requirements as other Masses in the Church. We should still avoid large gatherings and exercise caution.

All attendees over the age of 2 are to wear face masks or cloth face coverings (over the nose and mouth).

Those who are age 65 or older, those of any age with serious underlying medical conditions, and those who are sick, are encouraged to stay home and watch a livestream Mass.

Anyone attending Mass are to be screened before coming into the building. Their temperature is to be checked with the use of a medical-type noncontact infrared thermometer. They are to be sent home if they have any of the signs or symptoms of possible COVID-19.

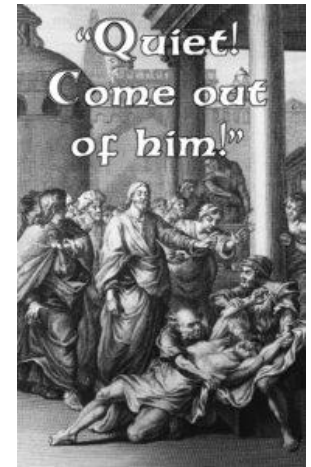

Reflexiones del domingo

1 Corintios 7:32-35

CLUB DE SOLTEROS

Estar soltero generalmente significa estar disponible. En nuestra cultura, los solteros son aquellos que aún no están conectados, como si la pareja fuera inevitable. Los familiares y amigos a menudo presionan a los solteros para que encuentren a alguien y se casen.

Pero algunas personas optan por estar solteras. Se están concentrando en otra vocación, por ejemplo, y no pueden dar al matrimonio y a la vida familiar la atención que merecen. Un estudiante dedicado dedicará su tiempo libre a estudiar. Algunas personas que desarrollan un talento en los deportes o las artes permanecen solteras debido a las exigencias de su oficio. Y algunas figuras religiosas son solteras para dedicar toda su vida a Dios.

En la tradición del Nuevo Testamento, varias figuras prominentes eran solteras, incluidos Jesús, Juan el Bautista, el apóstol Juan y el apóstol Pablo. Pablo explica las virtudes de ser soltero en una carta a los Corintios. "Un hombre soltero se preocupa por las cosas del Señor, por cómo agradar al Señor. Pero un hombre casado se preocupa por las cosas del mundo, por cómo agradar a su esposa, y está dividido".

Paul simplifica demasiado el caso; muchas personas casadas se dedican a las cosas del Señor y muchos solteros tratan de complacer a un amigo. Pero su punto es que las personas solteras tienen una oportunidad única de dedicar su atención a Dios.

Estar soltero no tiene por qué significar estar disponible. También puede significar ser tomado, por estudio, arte, deporte o fe.

Sunday's Reflections

1 Corinthians 7:32-35

SINGLES CLUB

Being single usually means being available. In our culture, singles are those who are not yet hooked up—as if the partnering is inevitable. Family and friends often put pressure on singles to find someone and get married.

But some people choose to be single. They are concentrating on another vocation, for example, and cannot give marriage and family life the attention it deserves. A dedicated student will devote free time to study. Some people developing a talent in sports or the arts remain single because of the demands of their craft. And some religious figures are single to devote their whole lives to God.

In the New Testament tradition, several prominent figures were single, including Jesus, John the Baptist, the apostle John, and the apostle Paul. Paul explains the virtues of being single in a letter to the Corinthians. "An unmarried man is anxious about the things of the Lord, how he may please the Lord. But a married man is anxious about the things of the world, how he may please his wife, and he is divided."

Paul oversimplifies the case; many married people devote themselves to the things of the Lord, and many singles are trying to please a friend. But his point is that unmarried people have a unique opportunity to devote their attention to God.

Being single need not mean being available. It can also mean being taken—by study, art, sport or faith.
