A NOTE FROM YOUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

First, I would like to thank you for your kind thoughts and prayers. After my mother's passing on Holy Saturday, I have been comforted by your notes, emails, and phone calls.

The outpouring of love and concern did not surprise me. We have a beautiful active parish community. The COVID-19 pandemic temporarily prevents us from gathering for public Masses. Yet, it does not stop us. We keep moving forward as brothers and sisters in Christ.

PARISH SCHOOL IN SESSION

For example, our parish school did not close in March. We only closed the campus. Mrs. Roll, our principal has guided our teachers who are teaching with distance learning. We are a STREAM school, Science, Technology, Religion, Engineering, Arts, and Math. They are using familiar and new techniques. They use Zoom meetings (with all the safety protocols), books & workbooks, phone, and Google Classroom. This is all supported not only by the tuition parents pay, but also from your CTSO scholarships and Adopt-a-Student contributions. Thank you.

CHARITY IN ACTION

Our parish charity outreach continues as well. Thank you for mailing or making online contributions to the work of the SSPP St. Vincent de Paul Society. The volunteers are talking to people over the phone rather than doing face-to-face interviews with people in need. They still make their house calls to deliver assistance for food and other needs. When they arrive, they call from outside and set the items at the door.

St. Vincent de Paul has been able to help many families during the pandemic including one single mom, Nina, and her three year old son. In addition to giving her much needed food cards, we also provided many food items that had been donated. Nina has felt quite lonely and a little frustrated during the mandatory shelter-in-place, especially with a three year old in the home. Although we were only able to speak with her by phone, we did pass along prayers with the food that we left on her doorstep. We even provided some Easter candies and a basket for her son that had been donated. Nina expressed much appreciation for the generosity shown her.

CHURCH DOORS OPEN

The doors to the church are open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. You are welcome to drop in to say a prayer. The Easter time sanctuary is beautiful. We did not buy lilies for the altar, but three families (at separate times) came to decorate. They even set up our traditional Resurrection garden at the baptistery. Thank you.
