A NOTE FROM YOUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Happy Mother's Day!

God bless mothers! We love you all year long. This one Sunday in May is a special opportunity to celebrate your vocation and pray for you. It is a happy coincidence that Mother's Day is in May, Mary's month. We ask the Blessed Mother to intercede for us, that her Son give graces to expectant mothers as well as those to who have children at home and to those whose children are grown.

During this pandemic, I am thinking of how difficult it may be for you to be with your mothers. There are limits on travel and on parties. I hope everyone may soon be able to do more than phone and online communications.

It has been one month since my mother Elizabeth passed on April 11. In February, there was a moment alone with her that I was both a little goofy and completely sincere in gratitude to her. I said, "You know, Mom, I've known you all my life." I hope she understood the appreciation of my 58 years with her. Once again, thank you for your thoughts and prayers. I have been particularly touched by those who have Masses offered for the repose of her soul. The Eternal Banquet is an image of Heaven, that is, communion in the eternal Presence.

Making Holy the Lord's Day

Normally, the Mass is the center of each Sunday. Our communion with God is renewed in the proclamation of the Sacred Scripture and the celebration of the Holy Eucharist. This restriction on public gatherings disrupts our routine.

Today, I would like to suggest that we take advantage of the break in our Sunday routine. This is a time when we can refocus Sundays as truly the Lord's Day. Let's use to our advantage the stay at home orders. Consider using Sunday morning for prayer and reflection. If you live with others, invite them to join you in viewing the Mass on EWTN cable or online. You could prepare for hearing the Sunday Scripture by reading the passages ahead of time. Make a note or two during the televised homily. Then, either alone or with someone else, bring the message into a prayer. And, since this is May, you might pray the Rosary later in the day. The Divine Mercy Chapel at 3 p.m. would be a good afternoon devotion.

Who knows? This may become a new routine for Sundays when we are all back at Mass in the church. That is, we may be happy that we have new ways to make holy the Lord's Day.
