As we continue with the "Phase One Reopening" of public Masses we are in need of ushers for the scheduled Masses:

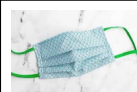

STILL ACCEPTING FACE MASKS AND DISPOSABLE GLOVES

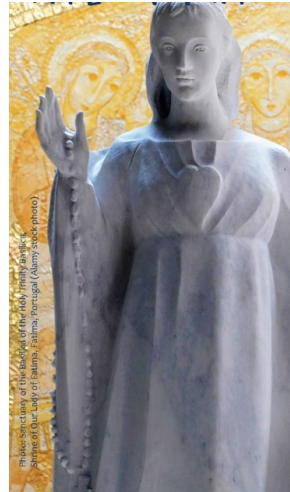

We too experience hunger. We need to be assured that the Lord is with us as we navigate the circumstances of our lives, some of which feel dangerous, if not to our bodies, certainly to our spirit. Our participation in the Eucharist provides this assurance and more: fed with Christ’s Body and Blood, we are drawn into communion with Christ and one another.
