Palm Sunday! “Hosanna to the Son of David; blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord; hosanna in the highest!” Jesus’ triumphal entry is viewed by many as a man on his “last trip”. By the grace of God to all believers, we all know that each step that He took brought us closer to our salvation, redemption and resurrection!
