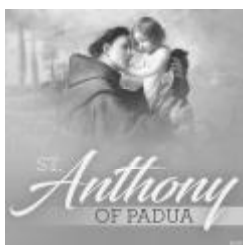

**SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

**From the  
Pastor's Desk**

Dear Parishioners,

In today's Gospel, Jesus: "Opens his mouth in parables, and announces what has lain hidden from the foundation of the world," even the loving-kindness of God the Father for fallen humanity, and the magnitude of the Trinity's rescue effort. It's our invitation to give up on fear, forgetting what lies behind in pre-Covid time's "normal," (which was nothing of the sort), and press on to what is infinite, for only the eternal satisfies.

Catholicism is not primarily a set of doctrines or dogmas, necessary and true that these may be; and it's not an ethical system separating good seed from bad; but "an event, an encounter, with the person Jesus Christ, who gives life a whole new horizon (eternity), and a definite direction" (follow the Lord from one degree of glory to the next, for he has conquered sin, satan and death by his Cross and resurrection). Therefore, God "rebukes temerity" in sinners enslaved and paralyzed by fear of death, saying: "Yes, apart from Jesus you can do nothing, but in Him who is your strength, you have strength for everything."

What if the parable of the wheat and the weeds is a prophetic interpretation of reality, and specifically the reality of how we are to treat each other in this special time? What if like Yahweh, we are to have unshaken confidence in the power of "the wheat" (the Eucharist) to sustain us through this present distress? What if we are meant to act on "the good ground of hope we have that God will permit repentance for our sins"? What if this hope extends to the sins of our neighbors? What if in Covid time we, the Church, are meant to be a sign to the world that as brothers and sisters we welcome honest dialogue and nourish it? What if the Holy Spirit is always and everywhere taking up our small prayers, refining and purifying them for presentation before God's throne? What if we begin to act on the Truth that love is stronger than death? What if, since "we have not gone this way before," (Joshua 3:4) Covid time is an invitation to do whatever is necessary to get closer to Jesus?

Let us pray!

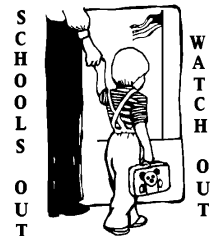
We are currently planning for various re-opening scenarios. Visit our website for updates.

**PUBLIC MASSES HAVE RESUMED IN THE PARISH**

As we navigate the reopening for public Masses at our parish, we are following the instructions from the archdiocese and limitations from the District of Columbia. In this necessarily fluid situation, please keep the following points in mind:

- The dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation issued by Archbishop Gregory on March 12th remains in effect until further notice.
- Under the "Phase 2" regulations of the DC Government, religious gatherings are permitted up to 50% of the capacity of the Church building, or 100 persons, whichever is less. Our limit is thus 100.

- Sunday Mass will be celebrated at 7 AM, 10 AM and 6:30 PM. Additional Masses and times for Adoration and Confession will be added as the need arises and priests are available.
- Under current regulations, everyone 2 years old and older must wear a face mask unless exempt (e.g., ADA), and distancing regulations, communion under one species, etc. continue as well.
