The Deacon's Corner

The Gospel of Life

October is Respect Life Month in the Church and today is Respect Life Sunday,

This takes me back to 1995 and the leadership of the now Saint Pope John Paul II, who was possibly the most pro-life pope in history. You may recall that it was in 1995 that he wrote the encyclical *Evangelium Vitae* on the Value and inviolability of human life. We may recognize this document by another name – “**The Gospel of Life.**”

Why should we be observing this day? Simply stated it is because our nation and the world has lost sight of the value of human life. Just think of the millions of unborn who have never seen the light of day. Just last year there we some 900,000 unborn aborted, never to see life outside the womb. **How sad! How horrible!**

The message of Saint Pope John Paul II was certainly very clear, that the most important fundamental teaching and principle of Catholic social teaching is that human life is sacred from conception to natural death...and that is because every man and woman is created in the Image of God, and inherently has a special dignity at every stage of their lives.

The Church mandates that Pro-Life is a pre-eminent moral issue! Any murdered (aborted) child is that: a murdered child and any Catholic who is “*personally opposed, but...*” is guilty of the sin of standing by and failing to intervene for the life of the defenseless innocent.

These are the words of Saint Pope John Paul II:

“The Gospel of Life is at the heart of Jesus’ message.

Lovingly received day after day by the Church, it is preached with dauntless fidelity as “good news” to the people of every age and culture.”

The encyclical *The Gospel of Life* was issued on the Feast of the Annunciation of the Lord in order to show how sacred human life must be – God assuming a human nature, was conceived in His Mother’s womb, and will remain the God-man for all eternity. As Saint Pope John Paul II reminds us:

“Man is called to the fullness of life which far exceeds the dimensions of earthly existence, because it consists in sharing the very life of God.”

October is Respect Life Month...let us make it every day of the year.
