The Deacon's Corner

Speaker at the National Catholic Prayer Breakfast

This Deacon's Corner is not in any way intended to be political, but the speaker just happened to be President Trump. He spoke of some personal memories from when he grew up in Queens, New York and saw how much incredible work the Catholic Church did for the community.

"These are amazing people," he said; and I'm sure none of you have read or heard on TV his positive comments about Catholics.

He went on to say: "These are amazing people and the Catholic Schools give many underserved children the chance to reach their God given potential." He went on to say: "Catholics of all backgrounds share the love of Christ with the most vulnerable as they care for the elderly, the homeless, and neighbors in need. **Our nation is strong because of Catholics....**"

"We believe in the joy of family, the blessing of freedom and the dignity of work and the eternal truth that every child born and unborn is made in the holy image of God....I will always protect the vital role of religion and prayer in American society, and I will always defend the sacred right to life."

In another personal moment, Trump said, "Melanie and I recently visited the shrine of St. John Paul II, a man who has had such a profound impact on our country and the world. It was an incredible visit." He then quoted St. John Paul II who had encouraged Catholics to let "the good news of Christ to radiate from your hearts and the peace that He alone gives remain forever in your souls....We are very grateful for the millions of Catholics across America who live these beautiful words and bring hope and joy and light and grace to the world."

As I said at the outset, this was not intended to be political...and I pray you didn't take it as such. It is always so good to hear positive words from a prominent individual, when our Catholic faith is constantly being maligned.

President Trump's talk took place on September 23 and it was virtually delivered due to the coronavirus and at that he also announced the he will be signing a Born Alive Executive Order to ensure that all the precious babies born alive after a failed abortion, and no matter their circumstances, receive the medical care they deserve. FYI, there are states that allow taking of the life of the born child.

October is Respect Life Month, may we be instruments for life issue, especially that of the unborn.
