The Holy Month of November

The Holy Catholic Church dedicates the entire month of November to the Holy Souls in Purgatory. During this entire month we are encouraged to pray for the faithful departed. This past Monday, November 2nd, was All Souls Day, also known as the Day of the Dead.

Saint Paul wrote this to the Romans:

"Are you unaware that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were indeed buried with him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in the newness of life."

Those in Purgatory cannot pray for themselves, so they must rely on us to pray and make sacrifices on their behalf. It is an act of charity that we can give for our loved ones and for those who have given us life, as well as our benefactors and those who have no one to pray for them.

Saint Gertrude the Great, according to tradition, was told by Our Lord that each time she prayed a prayer for the Souls in Purgatory, it would release 1,000 souls (or a great number) from their suffering in Purgatory. This is the prayer we are encouraged to pray:

*"Eternal Father, I offer Thee the Most Precious Blood of Thy Divine Son, Jesus in union with the masses said throughout the world today, for all the souls in purgatory for sinners everywhere, for sinners in the universal church, those in my home and within my family.
Amen."*

Take some time throughout this month to pray for the Holy Souls in Purgatory, and ask them to pray for each one of us once they reach Heaven! Let us pray, especially for our loved ones who have preceded us in earthly life.
