2021 - Year of St. Joseph

Most in the world didn't notice and many in the Church missed that on December 8, 2020, to mark the 150th anniversary of Saint Joseph's being declared the patron of the universal church, Pope Francis decreed a "Year of Saint Joseph" and published a beautiful apostolic letter entitled, *Patris Corde*, "With the Heart of a Father."

Apostolic holy years are meant to influence everything the Church does. As we've seen during the past holy years of the Jubilee of Mercy, the Great Jubilee of Redemption, and the Years of the Rosary, the Eucharist, St. Paul, Priests, Faith, and the Consecrated Life. The given theme provides special light to help us integrate and deepen our understanding and living of the faith as we relate each aspect of Catholic life to the theme of the year-long observance. The Year of St. Joseph is meant to have the same type of effect.

Its very first line, in which the apostolic letter receives its title, begins: *"WITH A FATHER'S HEART: that is how Joseph loved Jesus, whom all four Gospels refer to as "the son of Joseph".'*

I encourage all to take the time to read and pray with this reflection (www.vatican.va) on the seven characteristics of St. Joseph's fatherhood that Pope Francis reflects on, especially young adult men, fathers and soon to be fathers, single or married men of all ages. The Holy Father's reflection reveals them as St. Joseph being:

1. A beloved father
2. A tender and loving father
3. An obedient father
4. An accepting father
5. A creatively courageous father
6. A working father
7. A father in the shadows

Each one of these reveals a heart's desire and crucial path to being a man of God in a world of pandemic, ambiguity, and hostility on the identity and scriptural truth's about masculinity/fatherhood in the church and in society modeled by Christ and the Holy Family. All men and women of faith can benefit richly from this letter.

The name "Joseph" means "he will add or increase." His fatherhood was unambiguously in helping Jesus grow according to his humanity, and St. Joseph wants to help Jesus grow in all of us. The sure path to making that happen is through growing in devotion to St. Joseph in the coming year, since Joseph's whole life points to Jesus
