Shrine Catholic High School Extracurricular Activities

SLEC (Student Leadership Executive Congress): This group organizes a variety of school activities for the fun, enjoyment, and enrichment of Shrine's students and serves as a liaison with the faculty and administration. - Mrs. Boswell & Mrs. Schubeck

Drumline/Pep Band: An instrumental ensemble that performs at concerts and various school functions such as sports games and pep rallies. This group meets 1 day a week. - Mrs. Levoska

Knightsmen: A Men's Chorus that performs music from a variety of genres spanning from classical choral literature to contemporary pop and musical theatre. This ensemble performs at four concerts a year and often combines with Sweet Harmony, our women's choir. It is open to all men in grades 9 - 12 and meets 1 day a week. - Mrs. Malloy

Sweet Harmony: A Women's Chorus that performs music from a variety of genres spanning from classical choral literature to contemporary pop and musical theatre. This ensemble performs at four concerts a year and often combines with the Knightsmen, our men's choir. It is open to all women in grades 9 - 12 and meets 1 day a week. - Mrs. Malloy

Model United Nations: Model United Nations is a simulation of the UN General Assembly and UN Security Council, which introduces students to the world of diplomacy, negotiation, and decision making. Members of the MUN club participate in weekend conferences, represent countries in the UN, write position papers, and debate students from other participating schools. - Mr. Chisholm

Comic Club: This club is open to any student in grades 9-12 who have an interest in all things comic related. Students work together and/or separate on storylines and illustrations to design their own comic. Club attends Great Lakes Comic-Con and Motor City Comic-Con. Club meets 1 day a week. - Mrs. Laidlaw

Anime Club: This club is for any students grade 9-12 interested in Anime and related media. This club meets once a week and partners with Comic Club for field trips. - Mr. Folmar

Gamer's Club: This club is for any students grade 7-12 interested in video games, board games, card games and tabletop games. The club meets once a week after school and also hosts larger evening events every few months. This club partner's with the Comic Club and Anime Club for field trips. - Mr. Folmar

Spring Musical: Shrine High School's Performing Arts Department presents a musical every spring and auditions are open to any high school student. Being a part of the production helps students develop important life skills such as dedication, perseverance, commitment, and teamwork. Students perform on stage, help build and paint sets, work on costumes, lighting, sound, and play in the orchestra. - Mrs. Malloy

Fall Play: Shrine High School's Performing Arts Department also presents a fall production that could be a drama, mystery or comedy. Auditions are open to any high school student. As with the musical, students perform on stage, help build and paint sets, work on costumes, lighting and sound. - Mrs. Malloy

Hack Club: Hack Club teaches coding to students in a way that empowers them to build things and solve problems. Meetings are like mini-hackathons. People are working on projects and leading workshops introducing new technologies. This club is a chapter of the broader "Hack Club" initiative, which provides support and resources to the club itself (hackclub.com). No experience necessary--all students are welcome! - Mrs. Cerone

World Languages Club: Students meet once a month to learn about other countries' cultures, languages and traditions. Students also have the opportunity to organize a pot-luck featuring traditional dishes reflective of their heritage. - Mrs. Recinos
