Question of the Week

For Children: Who is the one person you most need to say, “I’m sorry” to in your family?

Liturgy of the Word

Saint Paul tells us that “God . . . has reconciled us to himself through Christ . . . and entrusted to us the message of reconciliation.” We see that dramatically in the first reading as Israel finally enters the Promised Land. Jesus illustrates it even more dramatically in the parable of the Prodigal Son, who encounters unconditional reconciliation with his father. After hearing these stories, let us ponder how we too can become messengers of reconciliation.
