WEEKLY REFLECTIONS

Question of the Week

For Children: Jesus showed that he loved Zacchaeus by having supper with him. How does Jesus show his love for you?

For Youth: Jesus saw Zacchaeus as he was – mistakes and all. What masks, if any, do you hide behind so others won't see who you really are? Who do you trust to see your true self?

For Adults: Why do you suppose Jesus was so kind to Zacchaeus? What lesson do you draw from this reading regarding those who are considered "public sinners" today?

Liturgy of the Word

Jesus was going to pass right through Jericho until he saw Zacchaeus in that tree. Instead he stopped, invited himself to dinner, and turned Zacchaeus' world upside down, saying that "the Son of Man has come to seek and save what was lost." As we contemplate God's mercy in these readings today, let us try to think of times when we feel lost, and how Jesus might catch sight of us and save us as well.
