WORKSHOP ON ADVANCE DIRECTIVES

Do you want to know what the Church teaches about end of life issues? Do your loved ones know what your wishes are about end of life issues? Lin Stewart, MSW, will be here on **Thursday, November 17th, 7:00pm** in the Bible Study room in the school to discuss all your options pertaining to advance directives.

What are advance directives? “Advance directives” are legal documents that allow you to plan and make your own end-of-life wishes known in the event that you are unable to communicate. Advance directives consist of (1) a living will and (2) a medical (healthcare) power of attorney. A living will describes your wishes regarding medical care. With a medical power of attorney you can appoint a person to make healthcare decisions for you in case you are unable to speak for yourself.

SHIELD THE VULNERABLE WORKSHOP

All Knights of Columbus and parish volunteers who work with children are required to be fingerprinted and complete a child abuse prevention and diocesan policy training program once every three years. This is done in the Sacramento Diocese through the “Shield the Vulnerable” on-line program.

On Saturday, November 12th, 11:00am, a Diocesan representative will be here in our parish to conduct a Shield the Vulnerable training workshop for anyone who does not wish to complete the program on-line.

We will also have a fingerprint service available for your convenience. Volunteers must be finger printed at every agency where they volunteer. For example: if you are a teacher or volunteer and were finger printed through your school, those results cannot be shared by the Department of Justice with any other agency.

We encourage anyone who may want to volunteer at the parish involving activities where children are present (Bible Camp, Faith Formation, Night of Enchantment, etc.) to attend this training. If you have any questions, please call the parish office at 365-8573.
