ALL SOULS

Because we know that death is not the end of life, it is not morbid for us Christians to visit the graves of our loved ones who have died. It is good to visit the cemetery, especially on November 2nd and then throughout the month of November, when the church celebrates the communion of saints and souls and looks forward to that harvest at the end of time when all will be gathered into the new Jerusalem.

We decorate the graves of our loved ones because we believe that in baptism they have died with Christ and thus Christ will raise them up. So we place on the grave an evergreen wreath – the ancient crown of victory over death and a reminder of the eternal life promised to us in the first sacrament. Or we light vigil candles on the grave, keeping one lit throughout November – a reflection of the light of Christ given to each one of us on our baptism day.

Remember Mary Magdalene and the other two Marys going to visit Jesus' tomb. Confident that what they found, you will one day find, make pilgrimages to the graves of your loved ones this month. Pray at each grave:

Eternal rest grant unto (name), O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon her/him. May she/he rest in peace. May her/his soul, and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.
