Friday: 9:00am – 12:00pm


Please Note: Our Office will be closed between August 10th and 14th. For a Pastoral emergency, please call our office at 519-893-1220 and leave a message.

Please keep in mind when coming to the office;

- The wearing of a mask in our office is mandatory except for those who are exempt under the Region of Waterloo By-Law.
- Please Maintain a two metre (6 foot) distance
- Visitors must attest that they are not exhibiting any signs of COVID-19 and have not been in contact with any COVID-19 Patient over the past 14 days.
- All Visitors must provide contact information
- Please maintain 2 metres or 6 feet of distance at all times
- If you feel unwell, please do not enter the office.

WELCOME BACK! We are very excited that our Parish is open again for Public Mass! In order to help stop the spread of Covid-19, we are following special health and safety guidelines from the Province of Ontario. **The Obligation to return to Sunday Mass has been suspended until further notice.**

If you choose to return to Mass at this time, please read these important Guidelines below;



Masks are mandatory at all places of Worship in Waterloo Region.



Please continue to be kind and charitable and follow the direction of local health authorities. Remember to always bring your mask when you come to Church. A mask is primarily to protect others, and the second reason to wear a mask is to protect yourself. Let's work together at St. Aloysius to help prevent the spread of COVID-19

Other helpful information;

- **All Masses are first come first served.**
- Seating is limited, only 30% capacity which is about 100 people at St. Aloysius
- **Doors Open 30 minutes prior to Mass and will lock during Mass.**

- **Please arrive at the main door of St. Aloysius** (*all other doors will be locked*) at least 15 minutes before Mass time. We need to allow extra time in between Masses to thoroughly clean the Church.
- Entrance is NOT permitted to those who have an elevated temperature, or are suffering from a cough or cold symptoms, shortness of breath, undue fatigue, loss of appetite, muscle aches, runny nose, chills involving shakes, loss of taste or smell
- If you are sick, you are kindly asked to stay home
- If you have traveled outside Canada within the past 14 days, you are not to enter the Church until you have completed the period of self isolation
- Everyone is to use the hand sanitizer provided
- Please Maintain a two metre (6 foot) distance
- Please follow the direction of Ushers will seat you at the available designated seats and follow their direction when exiting the Church.

Sacraments:



Gospel Reflection – Sunday August 9, 2020

Today's Gospel reveals what miraculous things can happen when one embraces a single-minded faith in Jesus Christ. Peter gets out of a wind-tossed boat when the Lord calls him. His faith is tested by his obedience to Jesus who is calling him out onto the water. In the midst of the waves and the wind, Peter gets out of the boat and walks toward Jesus. Good stewards heed Christ's call to them.

Sometimes that call directs them to take on seemingly impossible challenges. This week, reflect on how the Lord could be calling you out of the safety of your own "boat" to take on the impossible. In today's first reading, the Lord speaks through the prophet Isaiah during a time of political upheaval and moral decline. The prophet had warned of God's judgment against people for the feelings of self-importance they found in their possessions, and condemned them for various forms of economic injustice such as exploiting the poor and immigrants. Good stewards know that Isaiah's message is as compelling today as it was in the time of the kingdom of Judah: Do the right thing. Offer justice and compassion toward others.
