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**II. Elementary School Reopening Plans**

**Cleaning and Disinfection:** How shared surfaces will be regularly cleaned and disinfected and how use of shared items will be minimized.

**ADDENDUM**

Saint Anne School sent a survey to parents at the beginning of August. The results were posted in the Parent Newsletter, send on August 12th. These are the results that were posted:

- 77.6% were in favor of sending in the waiver to allow in person instruction
- 22.4% were not in favor of sending in the waiver
- 70.4% are ready to send their children to school in person, five days a week, if the waiver is approved
- 29.6% will chose either the Hybrid Option of two days a week, or Distance Learning

We received 98 responses which is very helpful in our planning for school to begin in 3 weeks. Many of our parents need to send their children back to school so that they can work as more than 75% of our children fall under the poverty line and receive Free or Reduced Lunch.

On August 12th a ZOOM Faculty Meeting was held to discuss the Waiver and the question was asked if everyone was willing to return to In Person Teaching should the waiver be approved. 100% agreed to coming back to school with a show of hands.
