SOCIAL CONCERNS

The **Poor Box** for the month of **May** is for the **McKenna Center** in Washington, DC. This social service agency began in 1983, under the initial urging of Fr. Horace McKenna, SJ, and with the encouragement of Cardinal Hickey. The McKenna Center serves homeless men and provides shelter, training, drug and alcohol counseling, emergency food, rental, and utility assistance, and most importantly, a place where men can regain their self respect.

Catholic Charities Legal Network counsels and provides legal representation to low- income and poor residents throughout the Archdiocese of Washington, D.C. and relies heavily on volunteer lawyers to fulfill its mission. The Legal Network handles most civil practice areas and criminal expungements.

We continue to collect food for St. Martin's Pantry in Gaithersburg (as we do year-round) with a group of volunteers delivering food weekly. The pantry particularly requests (listed in order of need as of May 11): Similac Blue Formula, baby diapers sizes 4 and 5, baby wipes, women's adult diapers, vegetable oil, canned soup, canned mixed veggies, canned fruit and Meals in a Can. These items are always needed but demand is acute at present. Brown paper bags are needed, as well as plastic grocery bags and the plastic newspaper bags. Please kindly leave your items in the marked basket in the vestibule.

Many of you may remember **Fr. Scott Garrett**, a priest of the Archdiocese of Anchorage in Alaska, who has visited the parish a couple of times where he shared his stories of life on the "Last Frontier". As he has been unable to travel due to the pandemic of the last 15 months, he is asking for our financial support in the continuing work of the mission Church in Alaska. He is assigned to Holy Rosary Catholic Church in Dillingham and uses his pilot license to provide the Eucharist for the homebound, and to visit the sick or the elderly in the local hospital or in their homes. **We are having the weekend of May 29/30 as a Special Collection weekend for the Church in Alaska.** You can also mail your checks in to the rectory - please make out to St. Bartholomew Church, memo line: Church in Alaska. 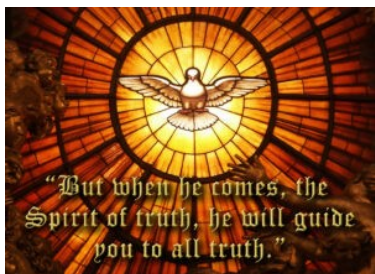
