SOCIAL CONCERNS

The **Poor Box** for the month of **May** is for the **McKenna Center** in Washington, DC. This social service agency began in 1983, under the initial urging of Fr. Horace McKenna, SJ, and with the encouragement of Cardinal Hickey. The McKenna Center serves homeless men and provides shelter, training, drug and alcohol counseling, emergency food, rental, and utility assistance, and most importantly, a place where men can regain their self respect.

Many of you may remember **Fr. Scott Garrett**, a priest of the Archdiocese of Anchorage in Alaska, who has visited the parish a couple of times where he shared his stories of life on the "Last Frontier". As he has been unable to travel due to the pandemic of the last 15 months, he is asking for our financial support in the continuing work of the mission Church in Alaska. He is assigned to Holy Rosary Catholic Church in Dillingham and uses his pilot license to provide the Eucharist for the homebound, and to visit the sick or the elderly in the local hospital or in their homes. **We are having this weekend, May 29/30, as a Special Collection weekend for the Church in Alaska.** You can also mail your checks in to the rectory - please make out to St. Bartholomew Church, memo line: Church in Alaska. **Living Wages Laptop Donations** - Living Wages Adult Education Center in SE Washington offers the National External Diploma Program (NEDP), an alternative to the GDP, to adult learners in the 8<sup>th</sup> Ward. The participants earn their diploma by completing a series of academic units that incorporate real-world skills in the learning process. Volunteers, some from our parish, assist participants in completing the work. NEDP, in response to COVID19, has recently upgraded their system to permit projects to be completed online from home. However, many students cannot complete their work because they do not have a home computer. If you have an unused Windows 10 laptop at home or work, please call Jerry Hoskins who will pick it up, remove your identity, data and applications, and deliver it to Living Wages. [It is also suggested that those interested could make a \$500.00 cash donation to Living Wages, who would then be able to buy a suitable laptop). All tax deductible. 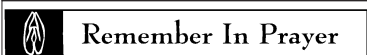

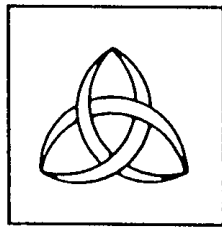
