The **Poor Box** for the month of **June** is for **Bethesda Cares**, a non-profit which serves the county's homeless and working poor.

Answering Jesus' Call To Serve "The Least" Among Us: the Ignatian Volunteer Corps (IVC) is a Jesuit-sponsored organization that provides men and women, ages 50 and greater (retired or semi-retired), with substantive opportunities to share their skills, talents and life experiences with nonprofit organizations that assist the materially poor or address policy issues related to poverty. A unique feature of IVC is a spiritual reflection component that helps volunteers discover the deeper meaning in their service and their lives. **IVC is currently recruiting Service Corps Members to serve with a variety of non-profit agencies in the District of Columbia and Suburban Maryland.** Typically, service is offered two days per week for ten months per year, with much of the service being provided remotely during the pandemic. The needs are great as our community responds to the challenges of the times, with our underserved schools in special need of retired educators to provide support in (virtual) classrooms. "Laudato Si' and the U.S. Catholic Church: A Conference Series on Our Common Home."

Registration is now open for the July 13-15, 2021 virtual LSUS conference, opening on July 13th with keynote addresses by His Eminence Blase Cardinal Cupich, Archbishop of Chicago, and Maureen Day, PhD, Assistant Professor of Religion and Society at the Franciscan School of Theology at the University of San Diego. Together, they will assess why the U.S. Catholic response to *Laudato Si'* has not been commensurate with the urgency and gravity of the climate crisis. On July 14-15, the conference will continue, featuring interactive breakout sessions in areas of the U.S. Catholic Church working to more faithfully incorporate *Laudato Si'*, areas such as advocacy, homiletics, environmental justice, parochial school education and youth and young adults. The conference will conclude on July 15 with a closing address by Sister Iliia Delio, OSF, PhD, Josephine C. Connelly Endowed Chair in Theology at Villanova University. Sister Delio will consider Catholic spiritual and theological insights that can enliven a more faithful commitment to care for our common home. The conference is free, but [registration](#) is required, and a freewill donation is encouraged to offset costs that include Spanish language interpretation. We hope to see you at the 2021 virtual LSUS conference!

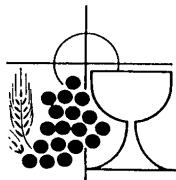
