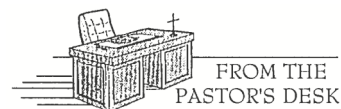

"Laudat Si' and the U.S. Catholic Church: A Conference Series on Our Common Home." Registration is now open for the July 13-15, 2021 virtual LSUS conference, opening on July 13th with keynote addresses by His Eminence Blase Cardinal Cupich, Archbishop of Chicago, and Maureen Day, PhD, Assistant Professor of Religion and Society at the Franciscan School of Theology at the University of San Diego. Together, they will assess why the U.S. Catholic response to *Laudato Si'* has not been commensurate with the urgency and gravity of the climate crisis. On July 14-15, the conference will continue, featuring interactive breakout sessions in areas of the U.S. Catholic Church working to more faithfully incorporate *Laudato Si'*, areas such as advocacy, homiletics, environmental justice, parochial school education and youth and young adults. The conference will conclude on July 15 with a closing address by Sister Ilija Delio, OSF, PhD, Josephine C. Connelly Endowed Chair in Theology at Villanova University. Sister Delio will consider Catholic spiritual and theological insights that can enliven a more faithful commitment to care for our common home. The conference is free, but [registration](#) is required, and a freewill donation is encouraged to offset costs that include Spanish language interpretation. XIII DOMINGO ORDINARIO 27 DE JUNIO DE 2021

Los milagros de Jesús confirman su persona divina. Sólo Dios tiene poder sobre la salud y la enfermedad, sobre la vida y la muerte y sobre los elementos de la naturaleza. Los milagros de Jesús son reflejo de la bondad y el amor de Dios que sale al encuentro de las necesidades espirituales y materiales de los hombres. A su vez, son camino de salvación para que el hombre se encuentre con Cristo. Es el caso de Jairo y de la mujer hemorroísa. Jairo es *un jefe de la sinagoga*, se postra a los pies de Jesús rogándole con insistencia: Jairo pide el don de la vida para su hija que mientras tanto ha muerto. Jesús pide fe a Jairo: *No temas, basta que tengas fe*. Jesús va a la casa de Jairo y al contemplar el dolor de los presentes entró en la casa donde estaba la niña, la cogió de la mano y le dijo: *¡Talitá kum!*, que significa: *óyeme niña, levántate*. La niña se puso en pie inmediatamente y echó a andar y le dieron de comer. Sucede, igualmente, con la mujer hemorroísa. Se acerca a Jesús con fe sencilla, toca el borde del manto de Jesús y queda curada: *Hija, tu fe te ha curado. Vete en paz y con salud*. Jesús es Dios, dueño de la vida, que confirma su poder sobre la muerte. Nosotros nos acercamos a Jesús y le pedimos con fe que nos libre de la muerte del pecado y nos dé la vida eterna. Que nos salve. Y experimentamos que Jesús nos dice: *tu fe te ha curado. Te devuelvo el don de la vida. No peques más*.

AVISO IMPORTANTE DECLARACIÓN DE LOS OBISPOS DE LA PROVINCIA DE BALTIMORE Y DE LA ARQUIDIOCESIS DE WASHINGTON

LEVANTAMIENTO DE LA DISPENSA GENERAL DE LA OBLIGACION DE ASISTIR A LA SANTA MISA

Los Obispos Católicos de la Provincia de Baltimore y de la Arquidiócesis de Washington han decidido levantar la dispensa de la obligación de asistir a la Misa dominical y en días de precepto y restablecer esa obligación a partir del sábado 26 y el domingo 27 de junio de 2021. En tal sentido, animamos a los fieles a volver a participar plenamente en persona de la Eucaristía dominical, fuente y cumbre de nuestra fe católica (cf. Código de Derecho Canónico, cánones 1246-1247 y Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica, 2180).

Esta obligación no se aplica a los enfermos, ni a los que tienen razones para creer que han estado expuestos recientemente al coronavirus o a otra enfermedad grave o contagiosa; ni a aquellos que están confinados en su casa, en un hospital o en un centro de enfermería; ni a quienes tienen problemas graves de salud subyacentes. Los protocolos de seguridad y las demás directivas litúrgicas de cada diócesis permanecen en vigor hasta que sean modificados o revocados por el respectivo Obispo diocesano.
