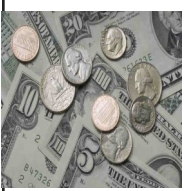
SAVE THE DATE - 15th ANNUAL FR. BULLOCK RUN, WALK, SHUFFLE

Father Robert Bullock was Pastor at Our Lady of Sorrows for 26 years, until he died in 2004. He was an avid runner, and since 2005 the Fr. Bullock Run, Walk, Shuffle has been held annually in his memory. Father Bullock connected the community, and the proceeds of the event are donated to Facing

History and Ourselves and to Youth Lead, two organizations dear to his heart, as well as to the Jimmy Fund in recognition of the fact the he died of cancer. Last year we had more than 250 participants, and approximately \$2,500.00 was raised and distributed to the three charities.

This year's event, the 15th, will take place on **Sunday, June 9, 2017**. With a kids race, a 2 mile walk and a 5 km run, there is something for every fitness level. The kids race kicks things off at **5:30 PM**, with the other distances following at **5:45 PM**. The first 150 to register will receive a commemorative T shirt.

Being Mortal by Atul Gawande

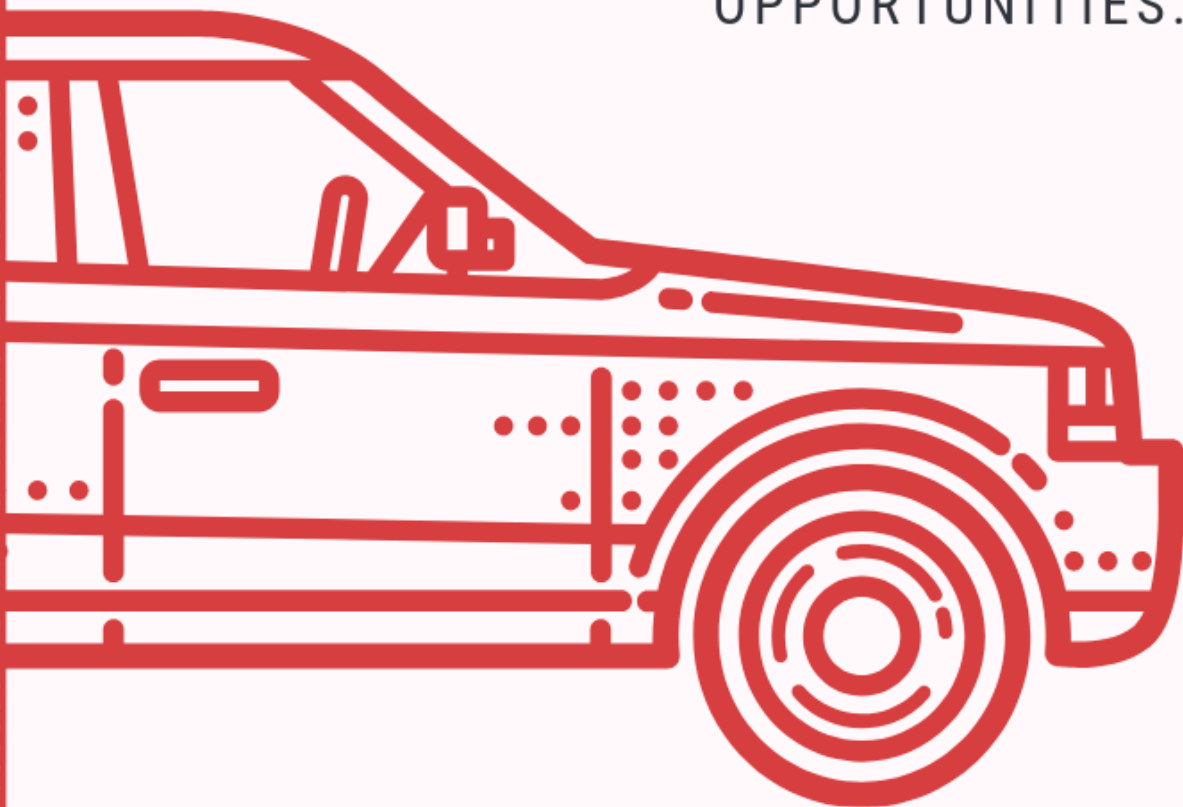
