Pastor's Desk

Over the past few weeks, I have talked quite a bit about the sacrament of Reconciliation. I am encouraging you to take advantage of the opportunity to participate in this sacrament as part of our Advent preparation. On this coming Thursday evening, December 12 at 7:30 pm we will have a parish celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Such a celebration usually includes introductory prayer, scripture readings, a brief homily and time for making an examination of conscience and the opportunity for personal confession. We will have multiple priests available. (See elsewhere in the bulletin for Confession times that Fr. Jerry is offering.)

Let's focus on the word Reconciliation and the reality it represents. We reconcile accounts which means making assure they come together as one. We reconcile with someone with whom we have had a break in our relationship caused by a dispute, an argument or a feud. It may be some other event in which we don't feel we were treated with respect or fairness or recognize that we have not done the same for another. I have known people that have had an issue with a family member that has gone on for years. In fact, it has occupied a space in their mind that bothers them or, at least, reminds them from time to time that they miss their relationship or that it would be good to clear this up.

Friends of mine have recently gotten the courage, put aside the stubbornness and taken the long view and begun the process of reconciling. There is relief, thanks that the other party responded and even joy in their telling of it.

We used to call the Sacrament of Reconciliation "Penance" and in popular parlance "Confession." To be sure those elements are still in it as they are in any reconciliation. But the emphasis has changed from a tribunal like recounting of sins to an expression of sorrow for those things in our lives including sins but also other imperfections that hurt our relationship with the Lord. The sacrament is not so much a judgment as it is an encounter with our friend, Jesus who loves us even when we are sinners and is constantly inviting us, calling us, beckoning us to repair the relationship. Unlike the family member above, He doesn't respond in kind. He is always with us on the way, on the pilgrimage where eternal union with Him is the ultimate destination. Reconciliation is his assurance that "we are still good with Him." The sacrament is his all-encompassing act of mercy because where we are concerned, He can be no other way.

So, we encourage you to try it. What I have said above may resonate in your life. If it does, or even if you just want to prepare for the coming of the Lord at Christmas, join us on Thursday evening. You'll be glad you did. For God's mercy and love will be palpable for you. That's how He wants it.
