On the Sunday after Christmas, the church celebrates the Feast of the Holy Family. The four Gospels do not provide detail relative to living as a young child or as an adult with his mother, Mary, and his father, Joseph. Yet, as observant Jews, at birth his parents brought Jesus to the temple according to the law.

As a youngster, it was the custom for his parents to observe the high holy days together. In this regard, the family lived a religious model for parents guiding their children in the faith.
