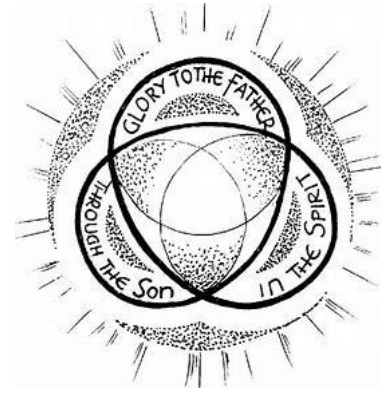

All teens in Grade 9 – 12 are always welcome! Even if you are in High school confirmation, you are welcome to join us for any meeting or activity.



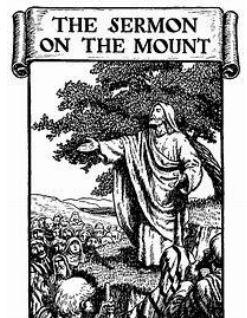
The week begins with **Trinity Sunday**, which always follows **Pentecost**. It celebrates the un-knowable relationship between the Father, Son and the Holy Spirit - and their loving support for us in our lives.

Tuesday is the **Memorial of Saint Boniface, bishop and martyr**. On Thursday, most of the world will celebrate the **Body and Blood of Christ**, (Corpus Christi). In the U.S., this will be celebrated next Sunday.

In the **Second Letter to the Corinthians**, Paul is defending himself. He tells the people of Corinth -- and us -- not to receive the grace of God in vain. Paul reminds them about generosity and cheerful giving. He begs the community not to dismiss him because of his poor speaking abilities saying, "Even if I am untrained in speaking, I am not so in knowledge." He boasts about his weakness, which he had at first begged to be freed from by the Lord, who said to him, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness."

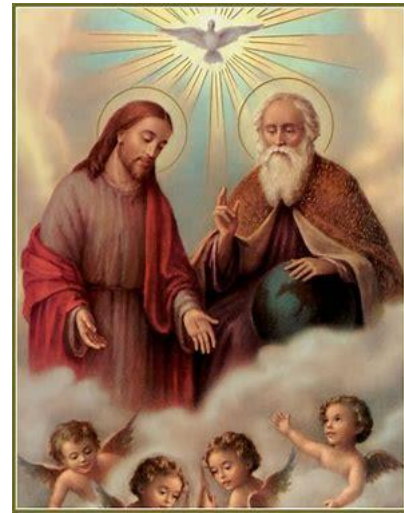
In the **Sermon on the Mount**

Jesus calls us beyond simply being moral. His message is not an "eye for an eye," but turning the other cheek, loving our enemies and praying for them. Jesus cautions us about performing good deeds for others to see. He teaches us to pray simply, because our Father knows what we need. "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and decay destroy, and thieves break in and steal.... For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be." Focus on God, not the world: "No one can serve two masters... You cannot serve God and mammon."
