

Dear Parishioners of St. John's,

May God's grace and His peace be with you. I hope that we are being careful at this time, taking precautions and being attentive to those with whom we live...especially if we or they are at high risk for the virus.

At the present time I am having our Church doors stripped, stained, and sealed to keep them in excellent condition. The workers will probably finish with the Church doors by the end of this week. They will then begin working on the doors to the Old Church.

In about three months we will begin another improvement to our St. John's parish property. Hopefully, beginning in September, I would like to begin work on renovating the parish rectory. The rectory (the house where the pastor lives) was built the same time that our Church was built and dedicated (1981).

For the last 39 years there have been no improvements to the rectory that I know of. We have been faithfully putting money aside for this improvement to the rectory since I began the Parish Improvement Fund collection on the first Sunday of every month.

The reason that I am writing to you is to inform you that for the next two or three weeks I will be occupied in moving all my personal items out of the rectory. Please be aware that I have been living in the rectory since January 15, 2009. Therefore, I have accumulated 11 years of "stuff".

My plan is to celebrate daily Mass, as usual, at 8:15 every morning and then spend the rest of the day packing and moving my books, furniture, and clothing to where I will reside. When I finish that part of the moving, I will then move the rest of the furniture (that belongs to the parish) into a storage space.

Why am I explaining all this? I would like for you to be aware that I will not be available in the Church office throughout the day. During that time if you would like to speak with me please call Norma at the Church office (972-563-3643) and she will contact me in case of an emergency. Otherwise, I will return your calls throughout the day.

If you have any questions, at this time, please call me. Stay cool in the coming days and remain in the Peace of Christ. I miss all of you and I hope that very soon we can gather at Mass.


The Eleventh Week of Ordinary Time




Sunday is the **Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ** - in the U.S. It is the great feast in which we celebrate the gift of the Eucharist, but also the special blessing of the presence of our Lord with us in the Blessed Sacrament. In Gospel, Jesus offers the most consoling good news: "Whoever eats this bread will live forever." The rest of the world celebrates the **Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time**. In **Matthew's Gospel**, Jesus missions his disciples to go out into the world: "Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, drive out demons. Without cost you have received; without cost you are to give." It is a message for us as Jesus tells us "The harvest is plenty, but the laborers are few" and calls us to join him in his work.

The first readings this week continue our readings from **1 Kings** and into **2 Kings**. It follows Elijah and Elisha - powerful prophet and agents of God's word for the people.

We continue Jesus' **Sermon on the Mount** in **Matthew's Gospel**. Jesus calls us beyond simply being moral. His message is not an "eye for an eye," but turning the other cheek, loving our enemies, and praying for them. Jesus warns us about performing good deeds for others to see. He teaches us to pray simply because our Father knows what we need. Where our treasure is, there our heart will be. We cannot serve several masters in life, so we can stop worrying so much and place our trust in God alone. "But seek first the Kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given you besides."



Daily Prayer This Week



There is nothing like the Sermon on the Mount to help us hear the message of Jesus, and to let ourselves be addressed by those words. All of us can ask for these graces with real specificity, that is, with real people and real daily circumstances in mind. We know with whom we need to "turn the other cheek" and to love more. We know the circumstances in which we are tempted to "be religious" in the right circumstances only. Upon reflection, each of us can take the time to "locate" our hearts, by discovering what we tend to "treasure." We can check ourselves out by making a list of the five most important things in my life. Then we can make a list of the five things I spend most of my time on. Comparing the lists will help us get concrete about asking the Lord for the grace we need to put our lives back in balance if we are not. All of us can name what we worry about. And, so we can all ask for the graces to "seek first" the Kingdom of God

All this reflection can happen throughout the week in the background of our daily life if we get into the habit of focusing for a few moments each morning. If we take just 30 seconds, at the edge of our bed each morning, it will begin to establish a habit of living more reflectively.

Thank you for this day, Lord. Help me to be focused today on not getting so hooked by Ann's ways or Bob's harsh words. I need your grace to place my trust in you. Help me especially before I have to talk with Ann on the phone and let me stay focused before Bill comes home from work.

Our version of a moment with the Lord - friend to friend - can be repeated and made more specific, while we are going about our day. Some days, we might have 20 such moments of prayerful conversation with our Lord - guided by the Word, the desires that are surfacing, and the events of our daily lives. And, each night, we can give thanks for this deeper relationship with the Lord that is developing in my heart.


