Peeking Into Grade 5

The fifth graders just finished reading *The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe* by C.S. Lewis. They learned about character, setting, and events as well as discovering the deeper meaning of the story. This novel is really a story about our Catholic faith and beliefs. C.S. Lewis wrote the Narnia series in order to teach children about the Bible and their faith. In the book the students witness Aslan, the "Great Lion", exchange his life in order to save Edmund. After being put to death, Aslan rises from the dead in order to save Narnia. Aslan is supposed to represent Jesus, who also died to save us from our sins. During this past Lenten season, we used this book to help us remember our faith and teach us how to be better in all that we do. The fifth graders also practiced writing summaries throughout this book about the events that happened in each chapter.

In grammar the students have been learning about adjectives. They learned adjectives, described which one, what kind, and how many. The fifth graders learned the importance of using a variety of adjectives in their writing when they had to finish a story titled "The Kingdom of Nice." The rule was that they had to write more sentences about this place using only the adjective "nice." These made for some very silly stories.

In writing, the students enjoy writing fiction stories based on a story starter. They have written a personal narrative about what really bugs them. The fifth graders also wrote stories with a Cinco de Mayo theme. All of these writing assignments have been very interesting to read.

In science, the fifth graders have also been learning about ecosystems. The students learned the four main parts of a plant and what the job of each part is. They have created food chains, identified producers, consumers, and decomposers, and learned how energy flows through an ecosystem. Now, the fifth graders will learn how ecosystems can change, are destroyed, and can be rebuilt. They are really enjoying learning about our natural world!

The cost of the trip is \$3,539 per person, which includes roundtrip airfare, hotel accommodations, breakfast, 3 dinners, sightseeing and entrance fees, local transportation, tour guides and gratuities.
