Recently our water consultant, Don Macko, completed testing of our water in three places in the school and two places in the rectory. In all locations the level was less than 2 milligrams per liter. The threshold is 15 milligrams per liter. This is a public notice that we have undergone lead testing and we are well below the levels for safety.
