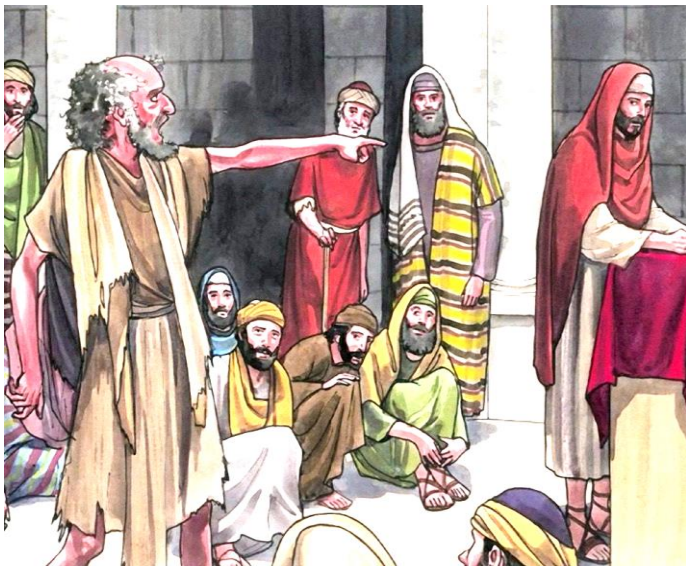

St. Joseph School Enrollment for 2021-2022

On January 11th our school began the enrollment process for the 2021-22 school year. **Enrollment is now open to everyone beginning February 1st.** Again, we fully expect, especially in the lower grades, to have full classes to our limit of 24 per class. Several grades are near capacity now. (Kindergarten 1st and 2nd grade are already full).

The High School Preparatory Program, grades 5, 6, 7, and 8 have multiple openings. This program tailors its offerings to fit the emerging individual talents of the students. Typically, students graduating from this program are leaders in their high school class.

Currently, from our graduating class this year, 2 have chosen St. Thomas, 2 have chosen Hoban, and 4 have chosen St. Vincent/St. Mary. All of these have won scholarship money after taking competitive tests.

SMILE...It Decreases Your Blood Pressure

A priest dies and is waiting in line at the Pearly Gates.

Ahead of him is a guy who's dressed in sunglasses, a loud shirt, leather jacket, and jeans. Saint Peter addresses this cool guy, 'Who are you, so that I may know whether or not to admit you to the Kingdom of Heaven?' The guy replies, 'I'm Jack, retired airline pilot from Houston.' Saint Peter consults his list. He smiles and says to the pilot, 'Take this silken robe and golden staff and enter the Kingdom.' The pilot goes into Heaven with his robe and staff.

Next, it's the priest's turn. He stands erect and booms out, 'I am Father Bob, pastor of Saint Mary's for the last 43 years.' Saint Peter consults his list. He says to the priest, 'Take this cotton robe and wooden staff and enter the Kingdom. 'Just a minute,' says the good father. 'That man was a pilot and he gets a silken robe and golden staff and I get only cotton and wood. How can this be?'

'Up here - we go by results,' says Saint Peter. 'When you preached - people slept. When he flew, people prayed.'

Today's Gospel passage is about God revealing his Son to the people in Capernaum. Christian stewards must recognize this act as God Sharing a gift with us. Though God could have acted in many other ways, he chose to send Jesus from heaven to earth to be with us – and not only to be with us, but to die for us! God gave us the ultimate gift, and asks us to share our own gifts with others in return.
