Dear Parishioners,

You may have noticed at Mass that we have started to use a chalice veil and burse to cover the chalice until the Offertory and then recover the chalice after Communion. In the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (no. 118) it says, "it is a praiseworthy practice to cover the chalice with a veil". Of course, we want everything we do at the Cathedral to be praiseworthy.

There are also some powerful symbols in the chalice veil. First it is a definitive sign that we have ended the Liturgy of the Word and have moved into the Liturgy of the Eucharist. It also calls to mind powerful scriptural imagery which can help us appreciate the grandeur of each Eucharistic Sacrifice. In the Ancient Kingdom of Israel there was a veil in the Temple, covering the Holy of Holies. When Christ died on the cross the veil in the Temple was torn in two, thus symbolizing the Old Covenant coming to completion and every obstacle between us and God being removed. This symbolism is also present when the chalice is unveiled. It reminds us that at each Mass, every obstacle between us and God is removed.

Another scriptural reference is the Transfiguration of the Lord. Our Lord's Divinity was concealed in His humanity as He walked on earth. But in the Transfiguration as well as after His Resurrection, His Divinity was on full display. So, the sacred vessels are covered through Liturgy of the Word, as our Lord's Divinity was veiled as He walked among us, and they are uncovered when the Liturgy of the Eucharist is offered and Christ's Sacrifice is re-presented to us in an un-bloody manner in the Eucharistic Prayer and Communion Rite. His glory is veiled in the appearance of bread and wine, but nonetheless, because of His real presence, it is on full display for us. The chalice is veiled again after Communion to tell us that we must take the glory and Divine gift we have received back into the world and our daily lives.

I hope this explanation will be helpful, and we will be able to appreciate the different parts of the Mass all the more so to enhance our participation and our appreciation of the great gift that we have in the Eucharist and in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

PRAYER TO ST. MICHAEL

Saint Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle. Be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil. May God rebuke him we humbly pray; and do Thou, O Prince of the Heavenly Host, by the Power of God, cast into hell Satan and all the evil spirits, who prowl through the world seeking the ruin of souls Amen.

Spiritual Adoption – The late Archbishop Fulton Sheen encouraged the spiritual adoption of an unborn child to help bring an end to abortion.

A “Spiritual Adoption” is done by praying the following prayer daily for a period of nine months so that one particular, but unknown, child’s life be spared abortion and allowed to live: **Jesus, Mary and Joseph, I love you very much. While this child will remain unknown to you, God knows who the child is and your prayers will make a difference for the baby and for both of the parents. At the end of the program (Sept 2021), you can donate gifts of baby items to a local pregnancy center to celebrate the birth of the child.

YEAR OF ST JOSEPH INDULGENCES

Because of the present and ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, the decree issued by the Holy See makes provision that those who are currently unable to go to Mass or confession due to public health restrictions may defer the reception of the sacraments of Eucharist and Reconciliation until they are able to do so. In addition, those who are sick, suffering, or homebound may also receive the plenary indulgence by fulfilling as much of the requirements as they are able and by offering their suffering and sorrow to God through Saint Joseph, consoler of those who are sick and the patron saint of a good and holy death.

The following prayers and devotional activities have been enriched with the opportunity to receive a plenary indulgence:

- To meditate for at least 30 minutes on the Lord's Prayer ("Our Father") or participate in a spiritual retreat of at least one day that includes a meditation on Saint Joseph;
 - To perform a corporal or spiritual work of mercy, inspired by the life and example of Saint Joseph;
 - To pray the Rosary together as a family or a couple, modeling the virtues of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph;
 - To dedicate with confidence their daily work to the protection of Saint Joseph the Worker, including the efforts of those who are unemployed, underemployed, or seeking more dignified work;
 - To devoutly recite the Litany of Saint Joseph or another suitable prayer from other liturgical traditions, especially for the intentions of persecuted Catholics in the Church and around the world, and for the relief of all Christians who suffer persecution;
- To devoutly recite another approved prayer to Saint Joseph, for example the "on page 2 of bulletin" especially on various feasts of Saint Joseph: March 19 (Solemnity of Saint Joseph), May 1 (Saint Joseph the Worker) or on the 19th day of each month, or even each Wednesday, the weekday traditionally dedicated to honor his memory with pious devotions.

Queridos Feligreses,

Es posible que hayan notado en la Misa que hemos comenzado a usar un velo de cáliz y bolsa para cubrir el cáliz hasta el Ofertorio y de nuevo después de la Comunión. En la Instrucción General del Misal Romano (n. 118) dice “es una práctica loable cubrir el cáliz con un velo”. Por supuesto que queremos que todo lo que hacemos en la Catedral sea loable.

También hay algunos símbolos poderosos en el velo del cáliz. Primero, es una señal definitiva de que hemos terminado la Liturgia de la Palabra y hemos pasado a la Liturgia de la Eucaristía. También nos recuerda poderosas imágenes bíblicas que pueden ayudarnos a apreciar la grandeza de cada sacrificio eucarístico. En el Antiguo Reino de Israel había un velo en el Templo que cubría el Santo De los Santos. Cuando Cristo murió en la cruz, el velo del Templo se rasgó en dos, simbolizando así que la Antigua Alianza se completaba y todos los obstáculos entre nosotros y Dios habían sido eliminados. Este simbolismo también está presente cuando se desvela el cáliz. Nos recuerda que en cada Misa, cada obstáculo entre nosotros y Dios se elimina.

Otra referencia bíblica es la Transfiguración del Señor. La Divinidad de nuestro Señor estaba oculta en Su humanidad mientras caminaba sobre la tierra. Pero tanto en la Transfiguración como después de Su Resurrección, Su Divinidad estuvo en plena exhibición. Entonces, los vasos sagrados se cubren a través de la Liturgia de la Palabra, como la Divinidad de nuestro Señor estaba velada mientras caminaba entre nosotros, y se descubren cuando se ofrece la Liturgia de la Eucaristía y el Sacrificio de Cristo se nos presenta de nuevo de manera sin sangre en la Plegaria Eucarística y el Rito de Comunión. Su gloria está velada en la apariencia de pan y vino, pero no obstante, debido a Su presencia real, se nos muestra completamente. El cáliz es velado de nuevo después de la Comunión para decirnos que debemos llevar la gloria y el don Divino que hemos recibido de regreso al mundo y a nuestra vida diaria.

Espero que esta explicación sea de ayuda, y podamos apreciar las diferentes partes de la Misa aún más para mejorar nuestra participación y nuestro aprecio por el gran don que tenemos en la Eucaristía y en el Santo Sacrificio de la Misa.
