For seventy years their files marked "secret" gathered dust in the National Archives until 1994, when at the site of their execution, a memorial was dedicated to them and to all African-American soldiers who fought in Europe. With Memorial Day being on May 28th, it is a fitting time to pay tribute to all veterans of WWII. We recently hired a lawncare company to cut the grass around the church, chapel, rectory, and to maintain the islands in the parking lot. This process was approved by Fr. Tom last year, and multiple bids were received before we decided on a service. The entire cost for this new service is \$50.00 per week. Up to this point, we paid \$40.00 per week for the grass cutting only and the care of the parking lot was done by volunteers only. With only one part-time maintenance man, it was determined that the lawn care needed to be outsourced. As you can see, the expenses were increased by only \$10.00, and now the parking lot will be maintained as well as the rest of the property.
