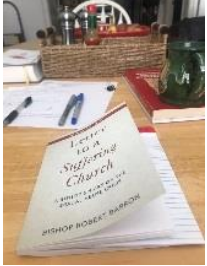

Through the kind generosity of a parishioner, the parish is able to offer each family 1 copy of the paperback entitled: *Letter to a Suffering Church: A Bishop Speaks on the Sexual Abuse Crisis* by Bishop Robert Barron. There's been a lot on this topic this past year: the Pennsylvania Grand Jury Report on 6 Catholic dioceses in Pa; the 2 former retired cardinals of the Archdiocese of Washington, DC at the epicenter; our former bishop's retirement and immediate preliminary investigation by Archbishop Lori; the completed extensive five-month report sent to the Vatican in March; June 5th The Washington Post leaked some details of this investigation; and our most recent July 17th follow-up letter to our diocese from Archbishop Lori concerning diocesan finances. We desperately need a forum to talk about our feelings and support one another within the community of mother Church. To facilitate this gathering, there are 3 simple steps outlined next to the books: STEP 1: Take 1 book per family. STEP 2: Read it (& eventually pass it on). This book is not meant to be kept forever but to pass it into as many hands as possible. STEP 3: Gather to discuss the book, the issue, the current crisis in our local and global church with either a morning or evening 2 hr. session on TUESDAY, AUGUST 6TH. Everyone is welcome and invite anyone who might like to join us using this book as our basis. If you like, Bishop Barron has a half-hour video interview which he talks about each of the 5 short chapters of his book.
