Our Spring/Lenten Adult Ed is Bishop Robert Barron's DVD series: *Seven Deadly Sins, Seven Lively Virtues*. It is on Wednesdays following the 6pm mass. Our 1<sup>st</sup> Session is Feb. 12<sup>th</sup>, Introduction. Taken from the back cover of the DVD: *Based on Dante's writings, the 7 deadly sins correspond to the 7 stories of Dante's Mt. Purgatory. Pride, envy, anger, sloth, gluttony, avarice, and lust are all presented as patterns of dysfunction within us that lead to unhappiness... The 7 lively virtues offer antidotes to each sin and help set us on the right path to healing and happiness.* This series can be used as an Examination of Conscience for a good preparation for the reception of the Sacrament of Penance/Reconciliation during this Lent. This may be your best confession in years.



Join us at St. Anns on the Fridays of Lent for Supper (6 to 7pm); Sacrament of Penance (Individual 6 – 6:45pm) and Stations of the Cross (7pm).



Part of one's almsgiving during Lent, a family/household may use the adult Lenten Coin Folders located on the table in the back of the church. This can be placed at the table where you take your meals or in your prayer space in your home as one adds the daily coin. The monies turned in by Easter Sunday will stay in our parish; go into our Poor Box to help our sisters and brothers who ask for assistance. There are young children's Lenten Coin Folders available thru CCD and on the table

in the church.

At the last Parish Pastoral Council (1-25-20), the item of campus security & security during any liturgical event was discussed. In the very near future, the hall side door will be locked by an usher 5 minutes before a scheduled service in church. Anyone coming after the hall door is locked, can come to the front of the church and enter either the double glass doors under the front porch or through the glass doors at the church entrance. This procedure will enhance better monitoring. (NOTE: Even if the side door is locked, it is still an EXIT because a crash-bar has been installed meaning no one has to unlock the door or use a key to EXIT from inside the Parish Hall).



We would like to form a Liturgy Committee with a voice on the Parish Pastoral Council. The membership will include someone who is active in a particular ministry to be a spokesperson/rep for the following ministries: music; liturgical environment/decoration; Ushers/Ministers of Hospitality; Readers; Extraordinary Ministers of Communion (at the altar & sick/homebound); & Altar Servers (adults & youth). If you are currently serving in a liturgical ministry & would like

to serve, please contact the office soon with your name and phone #. With Lent & Holy Week fast approaching, we can have an initial gathering before Ash Wednesday (Feb. 26<sup>th</sup>) after 6pm weekday Mass.



If you have any old blessed palms, you may bring them to church. We will burn them. You may burn them and sprinkle the ashes among your shrubbery or in your gardens. Blessed palms are a sacramental like Holy Water, Holy Cards, Prayer Books...that should be discarded in a respectful manner, not just thrown out with the trash nor poured down a drain/toilet.
