#### **Baptism Godparents**

Must be 16 years old, registered as an adult and be confirmed in the Catholic Church. If you are married, your marriage must be recognized by the church. This is especially important if you wish to be a Godparent for Baptism. It takes six months of attending Mass to be eligible for this privilege.

#### **Penance/Reconciliation**

We invite you to participate in the Penance & Reconciliation at the times specified in the front of this bulletin.

#### **Holy Eucharist**

We invite you to participate in the Holy Eucharist daily at the times specified on the front of this bulletin. If you have not had the opportunity to make your Holy Communion, please contact the Parish Office.

#### **Confirmation Sponsors**

Must be 16 years old, registered as an adult and be confirmed in the Catholic Church. If you are married, your marriage must be recognized by the church. This is especially important if you wish to be a Sponsor for Confirmation. It takes six months of attending Mass to be eligible for this privilege.

#### **Marriage**

The common policy of marriage requires that arrangements with the church be made at least one year before the date of marriage and before any social plans are made. Either the Bride or Groom must be a registered parishioner. If you would like to get more information about getting married, please contact the Parish Office.

Dear Brothers and Sisters, Happy Easter!

We have finally reached the seventh request in the "Our Father: "And lead us not into temptation" (Mt 6:13b).

With this expression, the one praying is not only asking not to be abandoned in times of temptation, but is also imploring to be delivered from evil. The original Greek verb is very powerful: it evokes the presence of the evil one who tends to grab hold of us and bite us (cf. 1 Pt 5:8) and from whom we ask God for deliverance. The Apostle Peter also says that the evil one, the devil, prowls around us like a roaring lion, to devour us, and we ask God to deliver us.

With this twofold plea: "do not abandon us" and "deliver us", an essential characteristic of Christian prayer emerges. Jesus teaches his friends to place the invocation of the Father above all else, also and especially in moments in which the evil one makes his threatening presence felt. Indeed, Christian prayer does not close its eyes to life. It is a filial prayer and not a childish prayer. It is not so infatuated with God's paternity as to forget that mankind's journey is filled with difficulties. If the last verses of the "Our Father" were not there, how could sinners, the persecuted, the desperate, the dying, pray? The last petition is precisely the petition we make when we are at the limit, always.

**STOP INFANTICIDE!**

Some states are proposing laws to expand abortion and to repeal laws providing specific protections for babies born alive after surviving an attempted abortion. (In a successful abortion, the life of the baby in the womb is ended and this is never morally acceptable. We continue to promote laws to protect babies in the womb.) The Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act (S.311/H.R. 962) would provide protections nationwide to help prevent newborns from being killed or being left alone to die.

Sadly, the U.S. had failed to pass the Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act, which protects babies who survive an attempted abortion from infanticide. But there is still hope for this bill.

If the US House of Representative passes the bill, it would put significant pressure on Senators who voted against the bill to reconsider their vote. Tell your US Representative that all new born babies deserve care and a change for life!
