### Baptism

Sundays at 1:30 p.m. (must be scheduled with the Parish Office) Instructions for new parents take place on the first Saturday of the month at 10:00 a.m. Please call Mrs. Christine Esposito at the Parish Office or email her at cesposito@stannparish.com to make arrangements.

### Baptism Godparents

Must be 16 years old, registered as an adult and be confirmed in the Catholic Church. If you are married, your marriage must be recognized by the church. This is especially important if you wish to be a Godparent for Baptism. It takes six months of attending Mass to be eligible for this privilege.

### Penance/Reconciliation

We invite you to participate in the Penance & Reconciliation at the times specified in the front of this bulletin.

### Holy Eucharist

We invite you to participate in the Holy Eucharist daily at the times specified on the front of this bulletin. If you have not had the opportunity to make your Holy Communion, please contact the Parish Office.

### Confirmation Sponsors

Must be 16 years old, registered as an adult and be confirmed in the Catholic Church. If you are married, your marriage must be recognized by the church. This is especially important if you wish to be a Sponsor for Confirmation. It takes six months of attending Mass to be eligible for this privilege.

### Marriage

The common policy of marriage requires that arrangements with the church be made at least one year before the date of marriage and before any social plans are made. Either the Bride or Groom must be a registered parishioner. If you would like to get more information about getting married, please contact the Parish Office.

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

Yesterday evening I returned from my Apostolic Journey to Mozambique, Madagascar and Mauritius. I thank God that he allowed me to undertake this itinerary as a pilgrim of peace and hope, and I renew the expression of my gratitude to the respective Authorities of these States, as well as to the Episcopates, who invited and welcomed me with such affection and attention, and the Apostolic Nuncios who worked so hard for the success of this trip.

The hope of the world is Christ, and his Gospel is the most powerful leaven of fraternity, freedom, justice and peace for all peoples. With my visit, in the footsteps of holy evangelizers, I sought to bring this leaven, Jesus' leaven, to the peoples of Mozambique, Madagascar and Mauritius.

In Mozambique I went to sow seeds of hope, peace and reconciliation in a land that has suffered a great deal in the recent past due to a long armed conflict, and that was struck last spring by two cyclones that caused very serious damage. The Church continues to accompany the peace process, which actually took a step forward this past August 1st with a new Accord between the parties. And here I would like to pause to thank the Sant'Egidio Community that has worked so very, very much in this peace process.

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This edition of our "Catholic Spirit" pays tribute to our catechists. How blessed we are to have an army of men and women, from the young to the more senior, who volunteer to serve in this wonderful ministry, helping our youth to know Jesus and His Church better through the many different catechetical programs our parishes host. In fact, the formation of our children as faithful disciples of the Lord is one of the most important works of the Church. St. Paul in his letter to the Romans expresses our gratitude for those who bring the good news to others beautifully: "And how can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone preaching to them? And how can anyone preach unless they are sent? As it is written: "How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news!"

Another blessing in our diocese is our Catholic schools and last week I had the chance to visit two – **St. Ann in Raritan** and **St. Thomas the Apostle** in Old Bridge. It was a joy to visit with the wide-eyed students, dedicated teachers and administrators. As you have heard me say before, one of the many blessings I have found in serving as the Bishop of Metuchen is the opportunity to visit our parishes and schools. The chance to support and witness the different catechetical and service initiatives taking place is so encouraging.

I was sad to learn, however, that for nearly 115,000 people, just in our four-county diocese, poverty is a day-to-day reality. Here in the Diocese of Metuchen, we are blessed with a rich diversity of ethnicities, cultures, languages, religions, and a broad economic diversity, too. The four counties in our diocese – Middlesex, Hunterdon, Somerset and Warren – are some of the wealthiest areas in our state, yet poverty continues to rise, especially in urban areas where there is an alarmingly high poverty and school dropout rate, some of the highest in the state.

### UNDERSTANDING STEWARDSHIP

There are many parable lessons in the Gospels where Jesus uses the image of the “steward” who has been entrusted with the Master’s property or wealth. A steward is a trustee or a temporary custodian who has been given the responsibility for caring and managing the property and for making sure that it yields as much as possible. Jesus also has many teachings that explore the relationship that the rich have to the poor, to justice and to the Kingdom. We have been hearing some of these lessons at recent Sunday Masses. These are very important issues in the mind of our Lord Jesus. As members of the Church, Jesus calls us to be disciples. This has astonishing implications.

#### *Christian Stewardship*

In their Pastoral Letter, “*Stewardship: A Disciple’s Response*,” the American Bishops define a Christian steward as one who:

- Receives God’s gifts gratefully,
- Cherishes and tends them in a responsible and accountable manner,
- Shares them in justice and love with others,
- And, returns them with increase to the Lord.

Three convictions underlie the Bishop’s pastoral:

1. Mature disciples make a conscious decision to follow Jesus Christ, no matter the cost.
2. Beginning in conversion, Christian disciples have a life shaping change of mind and heart that is expressed not in a single action, but in an entire way of life. It means committing one’s very self to the Lord.
3. Stewardship is an expression of discipleship, with the power to change how we understand and live out our lives.
