### Baptism

### Baptism Godparents

Must be 16 years old, registered as an adult and be confirmed in the Catholic Church. If you are married, your marriage must be recognized by the church. This is especially important if you wish to be a Godparent for Baptism. It takes six months of attending Mass to be eligible for this privilege.

### Penance/Reconciliation

We invite you to participate in the Penance & Reconciliation at the times specified in the front of this bulletin.

### Holy Eucharist

We invite you to participate in the Holy Eucharist daily at the times specified on the front of this bulletin. If you have not had the opportunity to make your Holy Communion, please contact the Parish Office.

### Confirmation Sponsors

Must be 16 years old, registered as an adult and be confirmed in the Catholic Church. If you are married, your marriage must be recognized by the church. This is especially important if you wish to be a Sponsor for Confirmation. It takes six months of attending Mass to be eligible for this privilege.

### Marriage

The common policy of marriage requires that arrangements with the church be made at least one year before the date of marriage and before any social plans are made. Either the Bride or Groom must be a registered parishioner. If you would like to get more information about getting married, please contact the Parish Office.

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

Let us continue the catechesis on the Acts of the Apostles. To the Jews' prohibition against teaching in the name of Christ, Peter and the Apostles bravely respond that they cannot obey those who wish to impede the Gospel's journey in the world.

The Twelve thus demonstrate their possession of that "obedience of faith" that they will then bring about in all men (cf. Rom 1:5). Beginning at Pentecost, indeed, they are no longer men "alone". They experience that special synergy that makes them decentralize themselves and enables them to say: "we and the Holy Spirit" (cf. Acts 5:32) or "to the Holy Spirit and to us" (Acts 15:28). They feel they cannot say "I" alone; they are men decentralized from themselves.

Strengthened by this alliance, the Apostles do not allow anyone to intimidate them. They have tremendous courage! Let us remember that these men were cowards: everyone ran away; they fled when Jesus was arrested. But, from cowards they became so courageous. Why? Because the Holy Spirit was with them. The same thing happens to us: if we have the Holy Spirit within, we have the courage to go forth, the courage to win many battles, not by ourselves but by the Spirit who is with us. They do not regress in their march as intrepid witnesses to the Risen Jesus, like the martyrs of all times, including ours. Martyrs give their lives; they do not hide being Christian. Let us consider, a few years ago — today too there are so many — but let us consider four years ago, those Coptic Orthodox Christians, true workers, on the beach in Libya: all their throats were cut. But the last word they said was "Jesus, Jesus". They did not sell out their faith, because the Holy Spirit was with them. These are today's martyrs! The Apostles are the "megaphones" of the Holy Spirit, sent by the Risen One to spread quickly and without reservation the Word that gives salvation.

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

To continue...Poverty has a significant impact on a family's ability to provide children with a quality education. Economic disadvantage is, in many ways, associated with educational disadvantage and yet, a quality education is critical to breaking the cycle of poverty. As a diocese, we are committed to education and, particularly, the education of the poor. Catholic schools in the Diocese of Metuchen work hard to give parents a choice by keeping Catholic education available and as affordable as possible to ensure our schools are for everyone, rich or poor. Our diocese provided \$796,250 in scholarships to needy students for this current year, thanks to donations from you, our faithful to the diocese and in the annual collection as well as from interest on some endowed funds held by the diocese in a sacred trust for this purpose.

As a new further effort, I am grateful for the recent establishment of Hope through Education, a newly incorporated, independent, nonprofit charitable organization. Hope through Education was established by lay people from throughout the diocese to try to close the educational gap by providing low-income families with partial tuition scholarships for children K-12 to attend private and parochial schools located in our four counties. This will be a God-send. As an independent nonprofit corporation, even businesses not able to donate to the Church are able to offer hope to the children of our diocese by helping them to attend private and Catholic schools. Through this partnership, I am indeed hopeful that we can make our Catholic schools even more accessible to our youth.

In its first organizational year, Hope through Education offered 26 scholarships of need-based tuition-assistance, totaling \$74,000, to qualified low-income students living in our diocese and though that amount is significant, the need is even greater. From the applications for tuition assistance we receive each year, low-income applicants are in need of more than \$2 million in tuition assistance. There is great need, but gratefully we are blessed with resources throughout our diocese too.

### **Priests Away During This Week**

The Annual Convocation for Priests serving in the Diocese of Metuchen is this week from Tuesday to Thursday, October 8-10. Deacon Rick will lead a Communion Service on Wednesday and Thursday at 7am.

### **REPAIR PLANS**

The Property & Facilities Management Director for the Diocese of Metuchen conducted an overall assessment of our parish buildings and grounds. He provided a report that lists various areas that are in need of repair. A process has begun of obtaining estimates for repairs. This information is needed in order to formulate a reasonable and measured plan forward.

The damaged church façade is a priority because of safety concerns. A plan is in place for a limited and temporary repair to the façade to be completed before this winter. A more comprehensive restoration will be done following a construction and financial approval process with the Diocese.

### **Your Financial Support for the Parish**

Changes are being made to the collection procedure in order to comply with Diocesan policy and to clarify what constitutes the ordinary operational needs of St. Ann Parish. These changes will challenge what you are used to doing and the way you are used to thinking regarding your support for St. Ann Parish and her mission. I am relying on your cooperation and understanding. I am trusting in your shared love and concern for your parish family. I am appealing to your good will.

The basic rule:

**First Collection is for the support of the ordinary operational needs of the parish.** Maintenance, grounds upkeep, seasonal cleanup... these are aspects of ordinary operation and ought not to have separate second collections. Those kinds of envelopes will be eliminated from your packet in 2020. We will keep envelopes for support of the Filippini Sisters, Social Concerns and some other things, but we will not have a separate second collection for them. Beginning in November, I ask that you simply place these other envelopes in the first collection along with your usual weekly church offering envelope.

**Second Collection, if there is one, is for special needs that have been mandated by the Diocese.** There are about 13 of these throughout the year. Any other second collections need to be approved by the Diocese.
