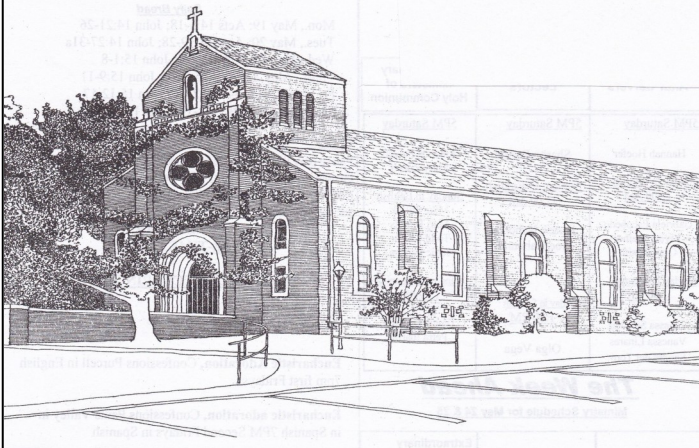

Dear Parishioners,

Greetings to you all. Hope you are doing well.

Here we are getting closer to Thanksgiving Holiday. I am sure that many of you have been looking forward to this holiday of thanksgiving, a time to get together with family and friends; a time to sit down to a delicious meal; a time to reflect upon all the earthly blessings God has showered upon us and upon this nation. When President Abraham Lincoln made Thanksgiving a national holiday, he was inspired by the pilgrims who left their home and came to a new land so they could have the freedom to worship God faithfully. Interestingly we see that in the Old Testament, the people of Israel had a similar experience. They had been slaves in Egypt where they were surrounded by unbelievers who worshipped false gods. But God rescued them and promised to give them a new home in an abundant land where they could worship God faithfully. However, it took over 40 years for God to get them there. God made them wander in the wilderness for 40 years in order to teach them to rely on Him for all they needed. In the same way, God has given us a land filled with abundance. We have many physical blessings that God has given us because He is merciful and He loves us. God wants us to enjoy these gifts. However, God also knows that there is a spiritual danger that exists whenever we have physical blessings in abundance. This spiritual danger exists not because physical prosperity is bad. Instead, the spiritual danger exists because our sinful nature so easily ends up worshipping the gifts and rejecting the One who gave them to us. I am sure that it applies to us also? God has given us many physical blessings. We are blessed in every way possible and we are tempted to say to ourselves: "My power and the strength of my hands have produced this wealth for me!" God gives us physical blessings because He loves us. But God also knows that physical blessings may lead us to forget the Lord our God. What is the reason for our forgetting God for His blessings? The fundamental reason is that we are too prosperous. But God warned Israelites that their prosperity would be the danger of forgetting God. They would be tempted to look around at their wealth and say to themselves, "By our hands, by our labor, we have achieved this, we have built a good life for ourselves." They would take credit for what God had given them. The same mentality exists in today. We enjoy so much prosperity, and yet we fail to recognize that its source is God. Why? Some-times we take our riches for granted. We feel that we deserve it. We imagine that we created it. If we become an ungrateful people, that poisons our entire system. It poisons our nation. It poisons our society. As a result, we become hostile, and we become small-minded, and we become hard-hearted. Our nation and our people are known for being generous of spirit, being large of heart, and offering a welcome hand to the immigrant and to the refugee and the poor. We realize the need of the other and try our level best to reach out to the most in need in the given situation. Let us have the same spirit of a large heart. I wanted to take this time to thank so many people who help the parish in so many different ways to be what it is today. It is because of the generosity of your time, talent and treasure that we are able to continue all that we could do to make the parish vibrant. As we celebrate the feast of Thanksgiving, I am grateful to each of you for what you are to me and more particularly to the Parish.

May you be rewarded for all that you do and for all that you are.

Estimados feligreses,

Saludos a todos. Espero que estés bien.

Aquí nos estamos acercando al Día de Acción de Gracias. Estoy seguro de que muchos de ustedes esperaban con ansias esta fiesta de acción de gracias, un momento para reunirse con familiares y amigos; un momento para sentarse a una deliciosa comida; un tiempo para reflexionar sobre todas las bendiciones terrenales que Dios ha derramado sobre nosotros y sobre esta nación. Cuando el presidente Abraham Lincoln hizo del Día de Acción de Gracias un feriado nacional, se inspiró en los peregrinos que dejaron su hogar y llegaron a una nueva tierra para poder tener la libertad de adorar a Dios fielmente. Curiosamente vemos que en el Antiguo Testamento, el pueblo de Israel tuvo una experiencia similar. Habían sido esclavos en Egipto, donde estaban rodeados de incrédulos que adoraban a dioses falsos. Pero Dios los rescató y prometió darles un nuevo hogar en una tierra abundante donde podrían adorar a Dios fielmente. Sin embargo, le tomó más de 40 años a Dios llevarlos allí. Dios los hizo vagar por el desierto durante 40 años para enseñarles a confiar en Él para todo lo que necesitaran. De la misma manera, Dios nos ha dado una tierra llena de abundancia. Tenemos muchas bendiciones físicas que Dios nos ha dado porque Él es misericordioso y nos ama. Dios quiere que disfrutemos de estos dones. Sin embargo, Dios también sabe que existe un peligro espiritual que existe siempre que tenemos bendiciones físicas en abundancia. Este peligro espiritual existe no porque la prosperidad física sea mala. En cambio, el peligro espiritual existe porque nuestra naturaleza pecaminosa termina fácilmente adorando los dones y rechazando a Aquel que nos los dio. ¿Estoy seguro de que también se aplica a nosotros? Dios nos ha dado muchas bendiciones físicas. Se atribuirían el mérito de lo que Dios les había dado. La misma mentalidad existe en la actualidad. Disfrutamos de tanta prosperidad y, sin embargo, no reconocemos que su fuente es Dios. ¿Por qué? A veces damos por sentado nuestras riquezas. Sentimos que lo merecemos. Imaginamos que lo creamos. Si nos convertimos en personas ingratas, eso envenena todo nuestro sistema. Envenena a nuestra nación. Envenena nuestra sociedad. Como resultado, nos volvemos hostiles, nos volvemos mezquinos y duros de corazón. Nuestra nación y nuestro pueblo son conocidos por ser generosos de espíritu, de gran corazón y por ofrecer una mano de bienvenida al inmigrante, al refugiado y al pobre. Nos damos cuenta de la necesidad del otro y hacemos nuestro mejor esfuerzo para llegar a los más necesitados en la situación dada. Tengamos el mismo espíritu de un gran corazón. SAFE ENVIRONMENT NOTICE

The Archdiocese of Oklahoma City through its programs, organizations and events, has numerous daily contacts with many children and young people. It is, therefore important that all Archdiocesan Personnel, clergy, seminarians, religious, employees and volunteers, protect the rights of children and be alert to the possibility for child abuse.

Under Oklahoma State law, all individuals MUST report an incident or suspicion of sexual abuse of a minor (person under 18 years of age) to the civil authorities. The Oklahoma Department of Human Services has established a statewide abuse reporting hotline for reporting: 1-800-522-3511. This number is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. If you feel a child is in immediate danger of harm call 911.

For the safety of children and the healing of victims, the Archdiocese of Oklahoma City provides an Abuse of Minors Pastoral Response Hotline for reporting the abuse of a minor (in the past or presently) by a member of the clergy or other church personnel: 1-405-720-9878. The Archdiocesan Victims Assistance Coordinator, a licensed professional counselor, will respond to calls to the Archdiocesan Pastoral Response Hotline. A report to the Archdiocese does not relieve the individual of the duty to report child abuse to civil authorities as required by Oklahoma State Law. In Oklahoma, failure to report child abuse is a misdemeanor punishable in law.

New safe environment training launched

The archdiocese announced a new and updated training program for volunteers, staff members and clergy that will be required before working with minors in the diocese's Catholic churches or schools. Learn more at archokc.org/safe-environment.
