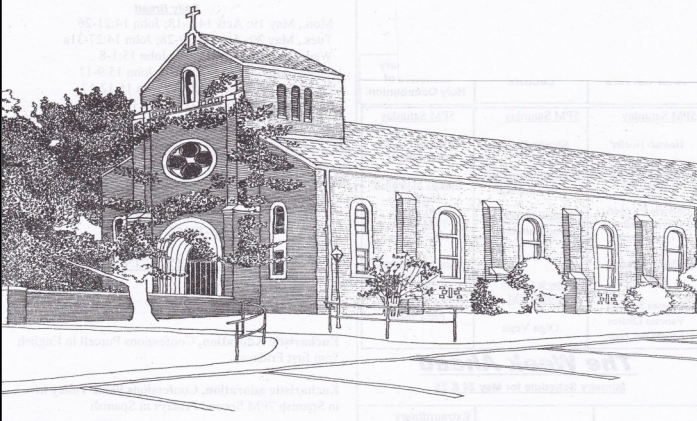

Dear Parishioners,

Greetings to you all from Fr. John Peter. I hope that you are doing well. I believe that with the arrival of the Covid Vaccine that many of the elderly parishioners of our parish are able to get the vaccine, although it is getting difficult to get one as the online slots are getting filled up very soon when they are open. It is good to hear that the elderly and people in the nursing homes are getting the vaccine before others. It is good to hear that they are getting protected and valued as they are more vulnerable. It is still hard to believe that the staggering numbers of those who are getting affected by Covid -19 is soaring up. I believe that we will be able to get back to normal life once the vaccine is available to everyone and one day we will be able to gather together and celebrate the presence of each other in the celebrations of the Eucharist and other sacraments.

The Church now has entered into the Ordinary Time of the Year with the Solemnity of the Baptism of the Lord as this feast takes the place of the First Sunday of the Ordinary time. There are 53 weeks in the year and all these 53 weeks of the year are divided with different phases and segments. The Ordinary time of the Year lasts for 34 weeks which begins with the Solemnity of the Baptism of the Lord and ends with the Solemnity of Christ the King of the Universe. In between there are other solemnities that take their importance as well. Solemnity of Christmas Time and Easter Time highlight the central mysteries of the Paschal Mystery, namely, the incarnation, death on the cross, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus Christ, and the descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. The Sundays and weeks of Ordinary Time, on the other hand, take us through the life of Christ. This is the time of conversion. This is living the life of Christ.

Ordinary Time is a time for growth and maturation. A time in which the mystery of Christ is called to penetrate ever more deeply into history until all things are finally caught up in Christ. The goal, toward which all of history is directed, is represented by the final Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe.

My Prayers for you all. Please keep safe and healthy.

Estimados feligreses,

Saludos a todos ustedes del P. Juan Pedro. Espero que estés bien. Creo que con la llegada de la vacuna Covid, muchos de los feligreses ancianos de nuestra parroquia pueden recibir la vacuna, aunque se está volviendo difícil conseguir una ya que los espacios en línea se llenan muy pronto cuando están abiertos. Es bueno escuchar que los ancianos y las personas en los hogares de ancianos están recibiendo la vacuna antes que otros. Es bueno escuchar que están siendo protegidos y valorados, ya que son más vulnerables. Todavía es difícil creer que la asombrosa cantidad de personas que se ven afectadas por Covid -19 esté aumentando. Creo que podremos volver a la vida normal una vez que la vacuna esté disponible para todos y un día podremos reunirnos y celebrar la presencia de los demás en las celebraciones de la Eucaristía y otros sacramentos.

La Iglesia ha entrado ahora en el Tiempo Ordinario del Año con la Solemnidad del Bautismo del Señor, ya que esta fiesta toma el lugar del Primer Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. Hay 53 semanas en el año y todas estas 53 semanas del año están divididas en diferentes fases y segmentos. El tiempo ordinario del año tiene una duración de 34 semanas que comienza con la Solemnidad del Bautismo del Señor y finaliza con la Solemnidad de Cristo Rey del Universo. Y en el medio hay otras solemnidades que también toman su importancia. La solemnidad del tiempo de Navidad y el tiempo de Pascua resaltan los misterios centrales del misterio pascual, la encarnación, la muerte en la cruz, la resurrección y ascensión de Jesucristo y el descenso del Espíritu Santo en Pentecostés. Los domingos y semanas del tiempo ordinario, por otro lado, nos llevan a través de la vida de Cristo. Este es el momento de la conversión. Esto es vivir la vida de Cristo.

El tiempo ordinario es un tiempo de crecimiento y madures, un tiempo en el que el misterio de Cristo está llamado a penetrar cada vez más profundamente en la historia hasta que todas las cosas sean finalmente recogidas en Cristo. La meta, hacia la que se dirige toda la historia, está representada por el último Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario, la Solemnidad de Nuestro Señor Jesucristo, Rey del Universo.
